TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The North of Newcastle-under-Lyme-Tarvin Trunk Road (A51 Tarporley By-Pass) Order 198

The North of Newcastle-under-Lyme-Tarvin Trunk Road (A51 Tarporley By-Pass Side Roads) Order 198

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

- (1) an Order under section 10 of the Highways Act 1980 providing:

- (a) that the roads about 2.34 kilometres (1.45 miles) and 50 metres (55 yards) in length which he proposes to construct west of Tarporley in the County of Cheshire, forming the A51 Tarporley By-Pass from Rode Street (A51) to Nantwich Road (A49) shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation; and

- (b) that the 1.26 kilometres (0.78 miles) length of the A51 North of Newcastle-under-Lyme-Tarvin Trunk Road from the starting point of the A51 Tarporley By-Pass to Rode Street to the junction with High Street (A49) in Tarporley shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Cheshire (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the A51 Tarporley By-Pass is open for through traffic; and

- (2) an Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising him:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;

- (b) to stop up highways;

- (c) to construct new highways;

- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises; and

- (e) to provide new means of access to premises,

all at Tarporley in the County of Cheshire aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Cheshire as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Orders and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 2nd June 1981 to 7th September 1981, or within 3 months from the date of publication of this notice, whichever period shall expire later at: Tarporley Post Office; the Public Library, Tarporley; the offices of Cheshire County Council at County Hall, Cheshire; and at Backford Hall, near Chester; the offices of Vale Royal District Council, Whitehall, Hartford, Norwich; the Department of Transport, 2 Marsham Street, London S.W.1; the North Western Road Construction Unit, Crystal House, Birley Street, Preston, and the North West Regional Office of the Departments of the Environment and Transport, Sunley Building, Piccadilly Plaza, Manchester.

Any person may, not later than 7th September 1981, or within 3 months from the date of publication of this notice, if such period shall expire later, object to the making of the Orders by notice to the Secretary of State at his address at the office of the North Western Road Construction Unit, quoting Ref. CNW 257/1/26/01 and 02, and stating the grounds of objection. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.
