Amendment to Conservation Area*

Notice is hereby given that the Westminster City Council, as local planning authority, has amended the Belgravia Conservation Area under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

The object of the designation of a conservation area is to preserve the character or appearance of areas of special architectural or historical interest, as distinct from individual buildings, to control development in such areas and to stimulate and encourage measures to improve the environment.

Section 277A of the above Act brings demolition of buildings in conservation areas under control by applying with modifications the listed building control provisions of the Act to all buildings in such areas. Anyone wishing to demolish a building in a conservation area must first apply for listed building consent to the Local Planning Authority. Such an application may be made separately or as part of an application for planning permission for the redevelopment of the site, but consent to demolish shall not be taken to have been given as part of planning permission for redevelopment unless specifically stated. In assessing whether or not consent should be granted, planning authorities will take account of the importance of the building to the character or appearance of any part of the conservation area.

Section 61A of the Act extends the control over trees in conservation areas by requiring that any person wishing to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree in a conservation area subject to certain exemptions shall give the Local Planning Authority 6 weeks' notice of his intention of so doing.

The amendments to the conservation area are described in the Schedule hereto.

A plan showing the areas is available for public inspection at the offices of the City Planning Officer, Room 10.08, Westminster City Hall, Victoria Street, London S.W.1, during normal office hours.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order hereinafter referred to as "the Order" made on 30th June 1981 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by Wyre Forest District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification will be to divert part of public path number 129 at Palmer's Farm, Rock, Bewdley in the County of Hereford and Worcester from a point commencing at the junction of this public path with bridleway number 128

at Palmer's Farm, and proceeding therefrom in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 80 feet (the limit of the diversion) to a route commencing on the north-east side of bridleway number 128 at a point approximately 46 feet north-west from the junction referred to above and proceeding in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 72 feet and there joining public path number 129 at the limit of the diversion.

A copy of the Order and the map contained there in has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Civic Centre, Stourport-on-Severn, Mondays to Fridays during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order must be sent in writing to the undersigned at the Civic Centre, Stourport-on-Severn, before 3rd August 1981.

If no representation or objection is duly made, or if any so made is withdrawn, Wyre Forest District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment any representation and objection which has been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
