

Exemptions will permit waiting for the purposes of picking up and setting down passengers, the loading and unloading of goods, the maintenance of the roads and the supply of statutory undertakers' services and emergency services therein.

An exemption will also permit waiting by disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the Orange Badge Scheme.

Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft Order which, together with a plan showing the lengths of road concerned and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected at the Post Office, Alston and the offices of the undersigned during normal office hours.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by 31st July 1981.
