Descriptions of Sites of Existing Paths or Ways to be Diverted

Bridleway No. 7 Parish of Cheddington Bridleway No. 16 Parish of Slapton

Commencing at the junction of the access to Model Farm, Mentmore with Mentmore Park Road, then continuing in a generally north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 120 metres, then turning easterly for a distance of approximately 585 metres, then continuing in a generally north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 500 metres to a point on the Slapton Parish boundary; then lastly continuing north-easterly from the last mentioned point for a distance of approximately 15 metres to a point where it rejoins the existing Bridleway No. 16 Slapton beneath Horton railway bridge, with a width throughout of approximately 1.8 metres.

Bridleway No. 8 Parish of Mentmore Bridleway No. 27 Parish of Wing
