Notice is hereby given that Rossendale Borough Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act, as amended, have made an Order entitled the Borough of Rossendale No. 5 Smoke Control Order 1981, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area.

Subject to the conditions and exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from achimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other

carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If made, the Orders will not come into operation before 1st July 1982 or before a later date determined by the Council.

Copies of the Orders and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected, free of charge, at the Town Clerk and Chief Executive's Department, Municipal Buildings, Church Road, Stockton-on-Tees, Cleveland at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from 24th July 1981.
