Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Wakefield, as agent for the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council, being the highway authority for the highway hereinafter mentioned, intends to apply to the Magistrates' Court for the Petty Sessional Division of Wakefield sitting at the Court House, Cliffe Parade, Wakefield, on Tuesday, 29th September 1981, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon for an Order under section 116 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising the said Council of the City of Wakefield to stop up for the purpose of all traffic the following lengths of highway at Ossett, namely:

HARTLEPOOL BOROUGH COUNCIL

HARTLEPOOL ENTERPRISE ZONES 1, 2 AND 3

The Hartlepool Borough Council Section 179 and Schedule 32, Local Government, Planning and Land Act, 1980

Notice is hereby given that whereas the Hartlepool Borough Council has been invited by the Secretary of State for the Environment to prepare schemes in draft under the above-mentioned section and Schedule with a view to the designation of the enterprise zones described and referred to in the Schedule below.

AND WHEREAS the relevant notice of deposit of the schemes in draft was first given on 5th June 1981, inviting representations thereon by 17th July 1981.

AND WHEREAS the said Hartlepool Borough Council has considered representations received falling within paragraph 2(3) of the above-mentioned Schedule 32.

Notice is hereby given that the said schemes prepared in draft have been adopted by the said Hartlepool Borough Council modified to take account of representations, that copies of the schemes as adopted have been sent to the Secretary of State aforesaid pursuant to the procedure laid down in the above-mentioned Schedule 32, that copies of the schemes as adopted are held on deposit at the offices of the Borough Planning Officer, Civic Centre, Victoria Road, Hartlepool, Cleveland, and that any member of the public may inspect the copies so deposited and make copies of or extracts from them without payment during the hours of 9 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. daily (Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays excepted).

Notice is further given that:

(1) if the Secretary of State aforesaid makes an order designating the areas to which the schemes relate as enterprise zones the order will have effect to grant planning permission in accordance with the terms of the schemes;

(2) if a person is aggrieved by any of the said schemes and wishes to question its validity on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the above-mentioned Schedule 32, or that any requirement of that schedule has not been complied with, he may within the period of 6 weeks commencing with the first publication of this notice make an application to the High Court for an order that the Secretary of State aforesaid shall not make an Order designating the areas as enterprise zones in pursuance of the schemes.

*In the District of Hartlepool, Cleveland**Enterprise Zone 1*

In the District of Hartlepool, Cleveland.

That area of land allocated to the east of the Road A689, more particularly delineated on the plan marked EZ1 and attached to the afore-mentioned scheme.

Enterprise Zone 2

In the District of Hartlepool, Cleveland.

That area of land located to the east and west of the road B1277, more particularly delineated on the plan marked EZ2A and attached to the afore-mentioned scheme.
