Control of Pollution Act 1974—The Rugby (Arches Lane/Butlers Leap) Noise Abatement Order No. 1 1981

Notice is hereby given that the Rugby Borough Council in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 63 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974, as amended, and all other enabling powers, propose to make an Order to be known as the Rugby (Arches Lane/Butlers Leap) Noise Abatement Order No. 1 1981. The Order will designate the area, the boundaries of which are described in the Schedule below, a noise abatement zone.

The general effect of the Order is to set limits on noise arising from existing and proposed premises in the area covered by the Order. Premises intended to be covered would be those in the categories of industrial, commercial and transport installations; domestic premises would not be covered. The noise levels would be established if the Order is made at the levels existing at that time and these levels would then be the set limit of noise.

A copy of the draft Order and of the map referred to in it may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable times in the offices of the Chief Executive, Town Hall, Rugby, during the period of 6 weeks from 28th September 1981. Any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing, addressed to the undersigned, object to the making of the Order within the said period.

SCHEDULE

From the point where Boughton Road crosses the River Avon north-east to the aqueduct on the Oxford Canal, then south-east to the road to Clifton, known as the Spoil Bank, then south to the Rugby-London railway lines, then west along the north side of the main railway lines to Mill Lane, then north to the point where Boughton Road crosses the River Avon.
