HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

City of Birmingham District Council Birmingham (Wainwright Street-Lichfield Road) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1981.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 1st October 1981, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the City of Birmingham District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish the public right of way running from a point 114 metres south-west of the junction of Park Street and Lichfield Road, Aston, Birmingham, West Midlands, shown marked "A" on the map annexed to the Order and running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 42 metres and having a width of 2.5 metres or thereabouts to a point shown marked "B" on the said map and thence running in a south-south-easterly direction for a distance of 42 metres and having a width of 4 metres or thereabouts to the point shown marked "C" on the said map which point is 127 metres west of the junction of Wainwright Street and Portland Street, Aston, Birmingham, West Midlands.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the City Solicitor, Paradise Place, Birmingham, between 8.45 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays and between 8.45 a.m. and 4.15 p.m. on Fridays.

Compensation for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of the Order is payable in accordance with section 121 (2) of the 1980 Act, to which reference should be made.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the City Solicitor, Paradise Place, Birmingham B3 3EH (Ref: LG/AI/9578) before 5th November 1981, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the City of Birmingham District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State
