N the 8th Instant four British Men of War failed from hence, having the Count de Mollard on Board, and a confiderable Sum of Mony for the Service of his Catholick Majefly's Forces in Spain. Hanover, July 24. N. S. Monseur Plesenberg, Envoy-Extraordinary from the Bishop of Munster, having been commission'd by his Master to endeavour an Accomm dation between this Court and the Chapter of Hildesteim, has succeeded in his Negotiation, and had his Audience of Leave of his Electoral Highness, fince which he is fet out for Hildesheim, where he is likewise to take his Leave of the Chapter, and return from thence to Munster. Hereupon the Troops of Hanover that were quartered in the Territories of Hildesheim have evacuated that Bishoprick, and are returned home. Monsieur Fabrice, Envoy-Extraordinary from his Electoral Highness to the King of Poland, is preparing for his return to Dresden, and has receiv'd Orders to follow his Polish Majetty, who is to have the Command of the Army appointed to ac against Pomerania. They write from Bremer, that the approach of the Danish Army had to terrified the Inhabitants of that Dutchy, that they were preparing to recire with their most valuable Effects.
