HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

*The Folkestone-Honiton Trunk Road (A27) (Fontwell Diversion) Order 198 and The Folkestone-Honiton Trunk Road (A27) (Fontwell Diversion Side Roads) Order 198.*

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

(1) an Order under section 10 of the Highways Act 1980 providing:

- (a) that a road about 1.1 kilometres (approximately 0.68 miles) in length which he proposes to construct at Fontwell in the county of West Sussex shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into operation; and
- (b) that the length of the Folkestone-Honiton Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of West Sussex (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new length of trunk road is open for through traffic; and

(2) an Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising him:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
- (b) to stop up highways,
- (c) to construct new highways,
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises; and
- (e) to provide new means of access to premises, all at Fontwell aforesaid,

and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of West Sussex as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Orders and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 7th January 1982 until 25th February 1982 or within 7 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, whichever period shall expire later, at the Department of Transport, 2 Marsham Street, London S.W.1; at the offices of the Director (Transport) South Eastern Region, "Edgeborough", 74 Epsom Road, Guildford, Surrey; West Sussex County Council, County Hall, Chichester; Arun District Council, Council Offices, Littlehampton; and at the Public Library, Surrey Street, Arundel.

DISEASES OF FISH ACT 1937

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made the Diseases of Fish (Infected Areas) (No. 3) Order 1981 and the Diseases of Fish (Infected Areas) (No. 4) Order 1981.

The Orders declare the following areas to be infected areas for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937:

- (a) an area comprising the Nettesheim Fish Farm, Lake Mochdre, Newtown, Powys;
- (b) an area comprising the Watermill Trout Farm, Raithby, Louth, Lincolnshire;
- (c) an area comprising the Tern Fishery, Broomhall Grange, Market Drayton, Shropshire.

The Orders provide that no person shall, without the previous consent in writing of the Minister, move out of the infected areas any live fish, eggs of fish or food-stuff for fish. The (No. 3) and (No. 4) Orders came into force on 25th and 31st December 1981 respectively.

THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1968,  
AS AMENDED

*United States of America: Official Certificate*

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Wales acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Imported Food Regulations 1968 (S.I. 1968 No. 97), as amended by the Imported Food (Amendment) Regulations 1973, 1979 and 1981 (S.I. 1973 No. 1351, S.I. 1979 No. 1426 and S.I. 1981 No. 1085) give notice that they hereby recognise, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the First Schedule hereto as showing:

- (a) that the poultry meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from poultry inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the poultry meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministers; and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Certificate is recognised subject to the following conditions:

- (i) Where the Official Certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the package containing the meat product, and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.
- (ii) Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to the extent shown in the Second Schedule hereto.
