## The Folkestone-Honiton Trunk Road (A35) (F Devon) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1982 (Honiton,

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, on the Folkestone to Honiton Trunk Road (A35) at Honiton in the District of East Devon in the County of Devon. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting at all times on either side of that length of Kings Road which extends from a point 46 metres east of its junction with High Street and Monkton Road to a point 162 metres east of that junction.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein. abled persons badgeholders and for a vehicle waiting upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden.
