MANCHESTER CITY COUNCIL

CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

City of Manchester (Anson Road) (Variation) Smoke Control Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Manchester in exercise of their powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above Act on 21st January 1982, made an Order entitled the City of Manchester (Anson Road) (Variation) Smoke Control Order 1982 declaring the areas described in the Schedule hereto to be smoke control areas which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Clean Air Act 1956, if on any day after the Order has come into operation smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control areas the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Subject to the provisions of section 9 of the Clean Air Act 1968 any person who acquires for use in a smoke control area or who sells by retail for delivery in a smoke control area any solid fuels other than an authorised fuel shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100.

If the Order is confirmed it will not come into operation before 1st October 1982 or before a later date determined under the provisions of the Clean Air Act 1956.

Copies of the Order and the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Department, Room 206, Town Hall, Manchester, at all reasonable hours during the 7-week period from the date of this notice.

Within this period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Romney House, 43 Marsham Street, London SW1 3PY, object to the confirmation of the Order.

If the Order is confirmed notice of confirmation will be published in the press and copies of the notice posted in the smoke control areas.

CLEAN AIR ACT 1956 (As amended)

The Sevenage Borough (Area No. 8) Smoke Control Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the Stevenage Borough Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act propose to make an Order entitled the Stevenage Borough (Area No. 8) Smoke Control Order 1982, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100 unless he proves that emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

The Order will not come into operation before 1st October 1982.
