GREATER MANCHESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The Greater Manchester County (Haymarket Street, Bury) (Prohibition of Waiting) (No. 2) (County) Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that on 3rd February 1982, the Greater Manchester County Council made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to exempt taxis on the existing prohibition of waiting at any time on the east side of Haymarket Street, from a point 10 metres south of Broad Street, for a distance of 37 metres in a southerly direction, in order that a Hackney Carriage Stand may be established thereon.
