Portsmouth, July 20. The Mareshal de Bellesonds being arrived here from ondon, intends suddenly to embark himself upon the Catherine Yacht which attends him for his transportation into France.

Venice, July 19. On Satturday last arrived here a vessel, cased the House of Loretto from Morea, telling us, that Segnior Nicolo Lyon, a Noble Venetian, having taken care to consigne to Cavalier Molino at Canea, the Presents and Moneys from the Republick to be employed according to Order in his Embassy to the Ottoman Port, went away to Suda, and thence to Cerigo, cruising afterwards in the seas of Saptenza in search after several Corsains of Barbary who had insested these seas, carrying also Orders to the Galcasses to attend the Commands of the Proveditor Bernardo, who has ordered two Troops of Horse to be embarked upon several ships which were Careening at Corfu, which are with the Fleet to be conveyed to Dalmatia.

This last week came in here two vessels from Smirna, laden with Merchants Goods; the Mariners reporting that the Visier intended to divert some time towards Rhodes, before he made his voyage to the Grand Segnior; but other advices tell us, he is ar-

rived already at Constantinople.

Several Complaints having been made at the Ottoman Court against the Maltha ships, Order has been given for a squadron of Turkish ships to be sent to lye about that Island, whereupon they are more intent then formerly to finish their works according to the design of their Ingineer Valperga, for which they have advanced a very considerable summe of Moreys?

A Caich sent hither express from Dalmatia by our Proveditor-General Barbaro informs, that the said General is returned from Catturo to Spalato, and is fince gone to visit the Counties of Clissa and Reggia, with other places, which is a work that hath not been practised for above 30 years before by

any of his Predecessors.

The Arbesan Gally is arrived at Dalmatia with the 13 principal Turks designed for an exchange, to whom the said General had added 80 more, which are to be sent to Zant by the same Gally in order to their freedom, upon the release of a proportionable number of Christians taken in the late wars.

The faid General has made an agreement with the Corfairs that were wont to disturb the Trade of the Merchants upon those Coasts, so that tis hoped the Christians may for the future Trade with greater liberty.

The Heydukes of Eattars have at the last obtain-

ed the favour of the Senate to be put into the polfession of Brisans as a reward of their late services, but upon condition, that they oblige themselves to be always in readiness to serve this Republick with their Arms whensoever they shall be commanded, and are now endeavouring to improve the Lands by their good Husbandry.

Here are lately arrived several German soldiers; entertained during the late wars in the service of the Republick, who are by Order to be paid and dismiss the service with a Donative of a Ducat to each man above his Arrears; they are also to have free Quarter for a considerable part of their way home, through the Territories belonging to this Republick.

Cardinal Barbarigo is lately arrived at Padua, having on his w y from Rome performed the Ceremony of giving the Great Duke of Florence the Habit of Grand Master of the Knights of S: Shephen.

There is lately arrived at Trieft, Cavalier Borri, a prisoner in Chains, with a guard of 30 soldiers, who are to convey him to Rome, where he was formerly sentenced for an extravagant Heretick.

Warlam, July 12. The Grand Constable the Uaywood of Rusky, the Uaywood of Kyomsky, with several other great persons, are with the Army which is more numerous than formerly, by the Addition of several German Regiments. Two Envoyes are there arrived from the Corsairs, one of them Employed from Dorosensko, the other from Hanenko the two heads of the opposite parties, desiring assistance one against the other, they were both of them treated with the Principal Officers of the Army by the great Constable at a Banquet, where the Envoye from Hanenko publickly gave a box on the Ear to the other Envoye, which occasioned no small mirth among the Officers.

Genoua, July 16. Two days fince parted the Conclusion, bound for Zant; the Fame is still in Port, but intends in few days to sail for Trepani.

From Milan they tell us, that the Duke d'Offune their Governour, has, with the principal Commanders and Officers of the Army, been at Pavia, where he took a view, first of the Spanish Foot, and then of the German and Italian Infantry, which were drawn up in several Batalions, in excellent Order: from thence he went to take a view of the Fortifications at Tortona, where he was received with all positible demonstrations of joy and respect, where he met with Cavalier Brelegno on his ret in from Maudrid, in which place he had been employd by the Republick of Venice with the Character of their Ordinary Ambasador, who after some few days stay, went thence on his way for Venice.

From Turin they write, that the Duke is at the present diverting himself in Hunting and other recreations at Chiavenno, one of his Houses of pleasure, but intends in little time to return hither, and afterwards to begin his progress to visit the several

confiderable places of his Dominions.

From Rome we are informed, that Cardinal Antonio Barbarino is dangerously ill, and given over by his Phylitians; and that the Pope has in favor to the Romans, granted the Princes Colonna and Orfino, the priviledge of ringing their Bell to call their servents together when any Cardinal visits

them.
