### MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FISHERIES AND FOOD

#### DISEASES OF FISH ACT 1937

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made the Diseases of Fish (Infected Areas) (No. 9) Order 1982.

This Order declares the following areas to be infected areas for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937:

- (a) an area comprising Cherry Tree Meadows, Melton, near Woodbridge, Suffolk;
- (b) an area comprising Moorland Trout Farm, Harome Site, Pickering, North Yorkshire;

- (c) an area comprising Latimer Park Trout Farm, Latimer, Chesham, Buckinghamshire;

- (d) an area comprising Lartington Fish Farm, Lartington Water Treatment Works, Lartington, near Barnard Castle, County Durham.

The Order provides that no person shall, without the previous consent in writing of the Minister, move out of the infected areas any live fish, eggs or fish or foodstuff for fish.

This Order came into force on 16th April 1982.
