The London-Bristol Trunk Road (A4) (Batheaston, Avon) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport proposes to make an Order under sections 1 (1)-(3) and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 on the London-Bristol Trunk Road (A4) at Batheaston in the County of Avon.

The Order is intended to improve vehicular and pedestrian safety on the approaches to and at the junction of that part of the Trunk Road, known locally as London Road East, with Stambidge—Five Ways Junction—and is complementary to the improvement of part of the Trunk Road and the provision of a "pelican" controlled pedestrian crossing at a point a short distance to the north-west of the Five Ways Junction.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any person from causing or permitting any vehicle to wait:

- (a) on the north-eastern side of London Road East between a point 100 yards west of the north-western side of its junction with Stambidge to a point 80 yards south-east of the south-eastern side of its junction with Stambidge.

(b) on the south-western side of London Road East between a point 84 yards west of the north-western side of its junction with Stambidge to a point 120 yards south-east of the south-eastern side of its junction with Stambidge. This prohibition will not apply to express motor coaches (express carriages).

This proposal means that the existing prohibition of waiting between 0800 and 1900 hours Monday to Saturday on the south side of High Street will be reduced by 14 metres. This length of road which includes the bus bay will be subject to a no waiting at any time restriction.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from, the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein, or for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.

Exceptions will also be provided in the Order for vehicles waiting on the direction of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, and also for disabled persons badgeholders.
