The Trunk Road (Croesyceiliog, Gwent) (Prohibition of U-Turns) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is that no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle proceeding in either of the carriageways

of the length of road specified in the Schedule to this Notice to make U-turns through the gaps in the central reservation of the said length of road so as to proceed in the opposite direction.

The Order, which will come into operation on 4th June 1982, shall not apply to the making of a U-turn through the gaps in the central reservation at the junctions of the trunk road with Turnpike Pond and Creekleen Pond. Turnpike Road and Caerleon Road.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan and statement of reasons for making the Order, may be seen during normal office hours at the Newport Borough Council Offices, Civic Centre, Newport, Gwent, during a period of 6 weeks from 4th June

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or that any requirements of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within the aforesaid period of 6 weeks apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

That length of the Newport-Shrewsbury Trunk Road (A4042) at Croesyceiliog in the County of Gwent which extends from a point 360 metres south of its junction with Caerleon Road in a general northerly direction to a point 20 metres south of its junction with Treherbert Road. (2 SI)

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE MANAGEMENT ACT 1979

Pursuant to section 139(6) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 and paragraph 1 of the 3rd Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and any enactment amending those Acts, certain goods, namely 160,000 boys' shirts imported in two consignments, namely, one consignment of 100,000 on or about 2nd May 1980 and one consignment of 60,000 on or about 2nd June at Hull, have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the ground(s) that:— 26th May 1982 the ground(s) that

(1) the said goods were imported contrary to the prohibition for the time being in force with respect by virtue of the Import of Goods (Control) Order 1954 as amended, made under the Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act 1939.
(2) the said goods being imported goods were found not to correspond with the entry made thereof in that their country of origin was stated to be West Germany when in fact their true country of origin was not West Germany.

Whereby and by force of section 49(1)(b) and 49(1)(e) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a solicitor in England and Wales who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly con-demned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
