The general effect of the Order would be further to amend the Barking (Waiting and Loading Restrictions) Order 1977, so that in Dagenham Road, between a point 27 metres south of a point opposite the northernmost wall of Rush Green Technical College, Dagenham Road and a point 33.22 metres south of a point opposite that wall —

- (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unload-ing a vehicle) would be prohibited at any time;
