DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Various Streets, Kingsbridge) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting, and One Way) (Comprehensive) Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that on 14th July 1982, the Devon County Council made an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, extending and consolidating existing restrictions in Kingsbridge.

When the Order comes into effect on 24th July 1982, you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle:

- (1) At any time in the following length of road:

Stentiford Hill, both sides, from its junction with Plymouth Road to its junction with Manor Park.

- (2) At any time from 1st May to 30th September (both dates inclusive) in every year in the following lengths of road:

Bowcombe Road, both sides, from its junction with the A379 at New Bridge in a northerly direction for a distance of 30 metres.

- (3) At any time between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday from 1st May to 30th September (both dates inclusive) in every year in the following length of road:

Church Street, north side, from its junction with Waterloo Road for a distance of 85 metres in a north-easterly direction.

Exemptions in the Order permit waiting for the purpose of boarding and alighting, loading or unloading, Post Office services, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water and electricity, pursuance of statutory powers or duties, taking in petrol, oil or air from a garage. The statutory exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles are included.

A copy of the Order together with a map showing the affected lengths of road may be inspected during usual office hours, Monday to Friday, at the offices of South Hams District Council, Follaton House, Plymouth Road, Totnes, or at the Town Hall, Kingsbridge, or at the address given below.

If you wish to question the validity of this Order or any provision made under it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the relevant section of the Act or that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made under it has not been complied with, you may, within 6 weeks of the date of this Order, apply to the High Court for that purpose.
