Notice of Proposal to Abstract Water

Notice is hereby given that the Anglian Water Authority propose to abstract 4.5 cubic metres (1,000 gallons) per hour, 109 cubic metres (24,000 gallons) per day and 39.8 thousand cubic metres (8,760,000 gallons) per annum from two wells in the river gravels at National Grid Reference TL 224 700 at its Fish Diseases Unit at Brampton in the County of Cambridgeshire.

The water will be used for fish research, stock watering, and amenities and will be discharged after sterilisation to the Brampton Brook/Great Ouse at National Grid Reference TL 223 707.

The Authority's proposals have been set out in the form of a draft licence Serial No. 6/33/22/45 and a map annexed thereto, and placed on deposit at the Old Treatment Works, Bromholme Lane, Brampton, Huntingdon, Cambs., and will be open to inspection by the public at such works free of charge at all reasonable hours during the period beginning on Friday, 6th April 1982 and ending on Friday 3rd September 1982.

Any person who wishes to make representations with respect to the proposals should do so in writing to the Divisional Manager of the Great Ouse River Division of the Anglian Water Authority at Great Ouse House, Clarendon Road, Cambridge CB2 2BL before the end of the said period. Copies of all such representations received by the Authority will be forwarded by the Authority to the Secretary of State for the Environment.

After expiry of the period the Authority will be entitled to pass a resolution by virtue of which the licence authorising the proposals shall be deemed to be granted unless the Secretary of State for the Environment either in consequence of any representations made with respect to the proposals or otherwise, requires the application for the licence to be made to him.

CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

City of Stoke-on-Trent (Order No. 37) Smoke Control Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Stoke-on-Trent in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act propose to make an Order entitled "The City of Stoke-on-Trent (Order No. 37) Smoke Control Order 1982", declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area.

The effect of the proposed Order will be that subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (2) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100 unless it is proved that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

A copy of the proposed Order together with the map referred to therein may be inspected by any person free of charge during normal office hours at the Town Clerk's Department, Town Hall, Glebe Street, Stoke-on-Trent and the Environmental Services Department, Unity House, Hanley, Stoke-on-Trent between the dates 3rd August 1982 to 21st September 1982.

Any person affected by the making of the Order may by notice in writing to the City Council object to the making of the Order, such objections must be received by 21st September 1982.

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SCHEDULE

The area to which the Order relates comprises north-wood, Birches Head and parts of Hanley and Sneyd Green in the City of Stoke-on-Trent, subject to the exemptions specified in the Order, the area includes properties in:

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

NORTH BEDFORDSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL

The North Bedfordshire Borough Council (Various Roads, Bedford) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Consolidation Order 1982, Amendment No. 6.

Notice is hereby given that the North Bedfordshire Borough Council acting as agents for the Bedfordshire County Council propose to make a traffic regulation Order under sections 1(1), (2), (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be to:

- (1) Substitute no waiting between the hours 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Monday to Saturday for the existing limited waiting along that length of the eastern side of The Crescent, Bedford, from a point 13.7 metres north of its junction with Bromham Road to a point 54 metres north of the said junction.
- (2) Prohibit at any time along:

(a) both sides of Barford Avenue, Bedford, from a point 25 metres south of its junction with Nicholls Road/Collie Road to a point 30 metres north of the said junction,
