The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that subject to the granting of planning permission under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 he proposes to make an Order under section 211 of that Act to authorise the stopping-up of the length of highway specified in the Schedule to this notice in the interests of the safety of users of the main highway which is to be constructed.

The proposed Order will require the provision of a new highway.

During 28 days from 3rd September 1982, copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Rhondda Borough Council, Council Offices, "Bronwydd", Porth, and may be obtained, free of charge from the Welsh Office, at the address stated below.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days, any person may by notice to the Welsh Office, Transport and Highways Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL (quoting the Ref. WR15/5/153), object to the making of the Order, stating the grounds of objection.

The Chester-Bangor Trunk Road (Holywell By-pass and Slip Roads Side Roads) (No. 2) Order 1982

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made the following Orders:

- 1. An Order under sections 10 and 41 of the Highways Act 1980 the effect of which is to provide that the following roads which he proposes to construct at Holywell shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation:
 - (a) A route (the main route) about 2.72 kilometres in length at Holywell in the County of Clwyd.
 - (b) Routes of slip roads to connect the main route with the superseded trunk road (A55) near Pwll-Melyn, Holywell.
 - (c) Provide that a length of the Chester-Bangor Trunk Road (A55) to be superseded by the new trunk road on the main route mentioned above shall cease to be a trunk road and shall be classified as a principal road as from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the County Council of Clwyd (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk road is open for through traffic.
- 2. An Order under sections 12, 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 the effect of which is to:
 - (a) authorise him:
 - (i) to carry out the improvement of highways;
 - (ii) to stop up highways;
 - (iii) to construct new highways, and
- (iv) to stop up private means of access to premises,
 all on or in the vicinity of the route of the above-mentioned trunk road;
