*Parish of Leekfrith (Footpaths Nos. 34 and 67)
Public Path Stopping-up/Diversion Order 1982*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 16th September 1982, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Peak Park Joint Planning Board.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert part of public path No. 67 to run to the east of Roach Side Farm, to stop-up part of public path No. 34 and provide an alternative path to the south of the existing.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

The Borough Council of South Ribble (Footpath No. 49 (Part of) Penwortham) Public Path Diversion Order 1981

Notice is hereby given that on 15th July 1982, the Secretary of State for the Environment confirmed with modifications the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from a point adjacent to the boundary fence of numbers 7 and 8 Kingsbridge Close Penwortham and running in a north-easterly direction for 116 metres approximately to a line running from a point adjacent to the boundary fence of numbers 7 and 8 Kingsbridge Close Penwortham in a westerly direction for 26 metres approximately, then in a north-westerly direction for 96 metres approximately then in an easterly direction for 53 metres approximately.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Civic Centre, West Paddock, Leyland between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

This Order becomes operative as from the date on which the Council shall certify that the said alternative highway has been created to its reasonable satisfaction but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from the date of this notice make application for the purpose to the High Court.

TENDRING DISTRICT COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS 1971 - 74

Designation of Conservation Areas

Notice is hereby given that the District Council have determined that parts of the Civil Parishes described in the Schedule hereto have been designated as areas of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance.

The effect of such designation is that by section 277A of the 1971 Act, except for certain specified exemptions, no building shall be demolished without the prior consent of either the District Council, as local planning authority, or the Secretary of State and it is an offence punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both, to fail to obtain such consent. Under section 61A of the 1971 Act, similar consents must be obtained before any tree situated in the conservation areas is felled or lopped.

Maps showing the conservation areas and a description of each area may be inspected at the offices of the Head of Planning Services, Town Hall, Harwich, Essex and of the Head of Administrative and Legal Services at the Council Offices, Weeley, Clacton-on-Sea, Essex during normal office hours.

Vale Royal District Council (Unnumbered Footpath Meadow Grove, Leftwich, Northwich) Public Path Diversion Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that on 15th September 1982, the Vale Royal District Council confirmed the above-named Order without modification.

The effect of the Order, is to divert the public footpath which runs from a point marked 'A' attached to the Order located in the north-east corner of a road called "Riverside" and proceeding in a northerly direction for a distance of 92 metres as far as a point marked 'D', to a realigned position where it runs in a north-westerly and then north-easterly direction to rejoin the existing path at the said point 'D' on Meadow Grove.
