

powers conferred upon him by section 19 (1) (b) of Part III of the Acquisition of Land Act 1981 (formerly paragraph 11 (1) (b) of Part III of the First Schedule to the Acquisition of Land (Authorisation Procedure) Act 1946) has certified that he is satisfied that the said land is required for the widening of an existing highway and that the giving in exchange of other land is unnecessary, whether in the interests of the persons, if any, entitled to rights of common or other rights or in the interests of the public.

A plan showing the land to which the certificate relates may be inspected at the offices of the Powys County Council, Highways and Transportation Department, Brecon Area Office, The Watton, Brecon, Powys, at all reasonable hours.

The certificate becomes operative on the date on which this notice is first published but if application is made to the High Court under section 23 (2) of Part IV of the 1981 Act within a period of 6 weeks from that date by any person aggrieved by the certificate the Court may, by interim order, suspend the operation of the certificate either generally or in so far as it affects any property of the applicant, and may, if satisfied that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any relevant requirement (as defined in section 23 (3) of Part IV of the 1981 Act) not having been complied with, quash the certificate either generally or in so far as it affects any property of the applicant.
