The effect is that no buildings in these Conservation Areas (including in the definition of building any structure of any kind) may be demolished without the consent of the of any kind) may be demolished without the consent of the Canterbury City Council (as Local Planning Authority) or of the Secretary of State for the Environment subject to the exceptions listed in paragraph 3 below. Pursuant to section 61A of the 1971 Act it is also an offence to cut down, top, lop, uproot or cause wilful damage to any tree in these Conservation Areas, subject to paragraph 5 below.

3. No consent for demolition of a building will be required in respect of:

- (a) Buildings with a cubic content not exceeding 115 cubic metres.
- (b) Any separate buildings, erected as permitted development under the provisions of Class I (within the curtilage of a dwelling house), Class II (certain gates, fences and walls), Class IV (temporary buildings), Class VI (agricultural buildings), or Class VII (industrial buildings), of Schedule 1 to the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977.
 (c) Any building required to be demolished by virtue of an Order or notice under planning legislation, the provisions in any agreement under section 52 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or by virtue of conditions in a planning permission.
 (d) Buildings included in a Clearance Order or Compulsory Purchase Order under Part III of the Housing Act 1957 or a demolition Order under that Act.
 (e) Ecclesiastical buildings for the time being used for (b) Any separate buildings, erected as permitted devel-

- (e) Ecclesiastical buildings for the time being used for ecclesiastical purposes (though consent would be re-quired for demolition of a building used or available for a minister of religion, wholly or mainly as a residence).
- (f) Ecclesiastical buildings in respect of which a redun-dancy scheme has been drafted under the Pastoral Measure 1968.

4. Ancient Monuments subject to control under Ancient Monument legislation and Listed Buildings, remain under the existing controls rather than under the Conservation Area provisions.

5. In respect of trees, consent will not be required to any action:

- (a) carried out on trees which are dying, dead or have become dangerous;
- (b) to comply with statutory obligations or to prevent or abate a nuisance;
- or abate a nuisance;
 (c) permitted under paragraphs (1) to (3) of the Second Schedule to the Form of Tree Preservation Order contained in the Schedule to the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation Order) Regulations 1969:
 (d) permitted by a felling licence granted by the Forestry Commission;
 (e) by or with the consent of a local authority on land owned by that authority;
 (f) to a tree whose diameter does not exceed 75 mm. over the bark at a height of 1.5 m. above ground level (or 100mm. where the action is carried out to improve the growth of other trees).
