CHESTERFIELD BOROUGH COUNCIL

Chesterfield (Town Centre) Conservation Area (Extension No. 1)

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended, that the Chesterfield Borough Council has determined that the area described in the Schedule to this notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which it is desirable to conserve or enhance and have accordingly designated the said area as a conservation area.

The effect of the designation of the conservation area may be summarised as follows:

- (a) Where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the conservation area is made to the Council and the development would, in the opinion of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the conservation area, the application will be subject to the special procedure in section 28 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended;
- (b) Anyone wishing to demolish a building or a part of a building situated within the conservation area must first apply for consent to demolition to the local planning authority. This is not taken to be included in a planning permission for redevelopment of the site unless, in granting the planning permission, the authority states that it includes consent to demolish the building. Some buildings may be exempt from this requirement.
- (c) Any one wishing to cut down, top, lop or uproot a tree situate within the conservation area must give six weeks prior notice of his intention to the local planning authority.

A copy of the map defining the conservation area may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Borough Planning and Estates Officer at the Town Hall, Chesterfield, during normal office hours.
