In the mean time, General Czeremet has desir'd the Senate to be on their Guard, and to give Orders for the Marching of the Auxiliary Troops on the Frontiers. Our last Letters from Warsaw advise, that the King of Poland had countermanded the Polish Army, and directed it to march out of the Lower Poland towards the Visula, in order to join the Troops of Podolia, and observe the Motions of the Enemy, and prevent their Incursions.
