(Restriction of Waiting and Residents Parking Scheme)
Order 1982*

Notice is hereby given that the District Council of Basildon pursuant to arrangements made with the Essex County Council under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Road Traffic Act 1974, intend to make this Order, the effect of which will be to impose an experimental waiting restriction in certain parts of the Kingswood area Monday to Friday inclusive, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., associated with a residents parking scheme.
