He 28th paft arrived here the Rofe of this place from Rotterdam, with little other news then that they are fitting up fome fhips to ferve as Convoys to their Merchants defigned for the Streights.

Yesterday arrived the Lilly and Prosperous of this place from Morlaix, telling us of a confiderable number of Souldiers and Seamen that have within few weeks passed through that place for Brest, where there are about 20. Sayl of Ships fitted up, whereof 12. lately came in from Rochel, and are supposed to be designed for the Streights.

Madrid, July 9, Monseigneur Borromeo the Popes Nuncio returning home to take possession of his Charge of Secretary of State to the present Pope, is gone to Barcellona, where he intends to Embarque upon one of the Duke of Tursies Gallies; which has lately brought thither the Chancellor of Milan.

From Sardigna we have news of the fafe arrival there of three fhips from Cadiq, with Men, Arms, and Ammunition, for the fupply of the Vice-Roy.

Letters from Cadiq advifeus, that the Duke de Veraguas arrived there privately the 22 past, and refused the Honors which the Town intended to have paid him upon his arrival.

A finall Bark is lately fent thence to New Spain, to inform them that the Fleet which is defigned thither, will in few days be ready to put to Soa.

The fame Letters inform us, that the Corfairs of Sallee have lately made feveral Prizes, amongft which are two French fhips, one Portugais and one belonging to Genoua, and that the Spanifh Garrifon in Meliglia upon the Coafts of Affrick, has had feveral encounters with the Moors, who have made divers Approaches and laid their Ambufhes near the place, but were always beaten off with great lofs., and with little difadvantage to the Garrifon; That place is now in a good poftwre of defence, the Walls which were fallen being well repaired and made up; and two new Forts lately built, which will add much to the ftrength of that place.

The Corfairs of *Algiers* keep within their Ports, and pretend to a great want of Slaves, for the Manning out their Veffels, but this is fuppofed to be only a pretence to excule themfelves from the Service of the Grand Segnior in the *Levant*.

Rome, July 12. The 29th paft, the Spanish Ambasilador came with a large Train of Lords and Perfons of great quality, Feudatories to His Catholick Majesty, attended by the Popes Guards to the Church of the Vatican, where after Mass, the Pope received from him before the Church Porch the Hackney and the Cedule for 7000 Ducats, the usual acknowledgment for the Kingdom of Naples, &c.

The 6th inftant arrived here a Courrier Extraordinary from *Madrid*; with feveral difpatches; most of which were addressed to Father *Nithard*, formerly her Catholick Majesties Confession, who as 'tis here supposed, may be employed with the Character of Ambassador from the Court of *Spain*, upon the Revocation of the Marquis d' Aftorgas.

The Conde de Prade has lately left of the Chara-

ther of Extraordinary Ambassiad dor from the Prince of Portugal, and contents him telf with that of Ambassiador in Ordinary.

By the way of Otranto we are told, That two Maltha Ships had lately engaged 3 Corlairs belonging to Algiers, and had taken one of them after a fharp Dilpute, which continued two hours, the other two with fome difficulty escaping.

Here is lately proposed a Treaty of Marriage between Prince *Altieri's* Sister and Don *Eugento* a third Son of the Prince *de Carbognano*, but the Constable *Colonna* endeavors to prevent it, having defigned her for a Wife to one of his Sons.

Copenhagen, July 22. His Excellency the Earl of Esternishing the second second second second second second train, having concluded his Negotiation in this Court, and the Treaty of Commerce, which was yeflerday figned by the King of Denmark, intends in fhort time to return for England, having entertained a Dutch fhip for the transportation of his Domelticks, with his horfes and baggage; Himfelf with his Lady intending to return fome part of the way by land, and to take Holland in his way.

The Heer de Witt, Ambassador from the States General of the Vnited Provinces is taking his leave of this Court intending for Poland.

Several complaints have been here exhibited by the Holland Merchants, against the customers, for visiting such of their ships as pass the *Sound* and requiring new customes.
