NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LICENCES TO OBSTRUCT OR IMPEDE THE FLOW OF AN IN-LAND WATERS BY MEANS OF IMPOUNDING WORKS.

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Severn-Trent Water Authority by C. M. Brewster; G. Bayliss of Haughton House Farm, Shifnal, Shropshire, for licences to obstruct or impede the flow of the Blithbury Brook and also two land drains by means of Earth (Clay) Embankments at NGR SJ 733089 and SJ 735088.

The object of impounding water by means of the works is to create two amenity fishing pools. The capacity of the reservoir at overflow level will be 2,400 cubic metres and 20,000 cubic metres respectively.

Further details of the application are: once the Reservoirs have been filled water will not be abstracted.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

AVON COUNTY COUNCIL

County of Avon (Various Roads, Bourneville, Weston-Super-Mare, District of Woodspring) (Prohibition of Commercial Vehicles of Over 7.5 Tonnes Maximum Gross Weight) Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that on 16th December 1982 the County Council of Avon made an Order under section 1 (f), (2), (3), (3AA) and (6) of the Road Traffic Regulation

Act 1967, as amended and section 1 of the Heavy Commercial Vehicles (Controls and Regulations) Act 1973, the effect of which is to prohibit any heavy commercial vehicle, having a maximum gross weight of 7.5 tonnes and an unladen weight exceeding 3.05 tonnes as defined in Regulation 4 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1981, from proceeding in any of the roads specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions are provided in the Order for any heavy commercial vehicle to be used for the conveyance of goods to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the road; in connection with statutory powers or duties, building operations, agriculture, forestry, the maintenance of the road or services therein; for the removal of obstruction to traffic; fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes; the conveyance of goods for sale from the vehicle and for the garaging, servicing or carrying out of repairs to the vehicle.

The Order will come into operation on 5th January 1983 and a copy thereof together with a map may be inspected at the undermentioned offices (6th floor) during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks after the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
