TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Registrar's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, the 7th January 1983 at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 10th January 1983 to Friday, 14th January 1983 inclusive and will be due 91 days after
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.
- 8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders. (1 SI) (1 SĬ)

THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Chester-Bangor Trunk Road and The Dolgellau-South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (Hawarden By Pass and Slip Roads) (Variation) Order 1982.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 10 of the Highways he has made an Order under section 10 of the Highways Act 1980 which authorises him to vary the powers conferred by the Chester-Bangor Trunk Road and the Dolgellau-South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (Hawarden Bý Pass and Slip Roads) Order 1978 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1978 Order"), and enables him to reduce the length of the existing Trunk Road proposed to be detrunked by the 1978 Order.

The length of highway which is not now to be detrunked is part of the highway known as the Chester-Southerly By Pass and extends from a point 327 metres cast of the point where Broughten Hall Road crosses

east of the point where Broughton Hall Road crosses
