HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 116

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council intend to apply to the Plymouth Magistrates' Court sitting at St. Andrew Street, Plymouth, at 10 a.m. on Friday, 18th February 1983 for an Order that all public rights of way over the lengths of highway described in Schedules 1 to 7 hereto be extinguished.

The aforesaid lengths of public highway are shown hatched in black upon a plan which may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of the Area County Secretary (West) 4th Floor, Civic Centre, Plymouth. SCHEDULE 1

Rear lane to the west of Well Street, Plymouth being a 4.6 metre wide lane extending 106 metres southwards from its junction with the back of the footway in Hastings Terrace.

SCHEDULE 2

A 7.9 metre wide carriageway known as Well Street with two 1.7 metre wide footways extending a maximum of 100 metres southwards from its junction with the back of the footway in Hastings Terrace.

SCHEDULE 3

A 4.55 metre wide lane being the rear lane to the east of Well Street which extends 73 metres southwards from its junction with the back of the footway in Hastings Terrace.

SCHEDULE 4

A 7.95 metre wide carriageway known as Tracy Street with two 1.8 metre wide footways which extend a maximum of 60 metres southwards from its junction with the back of the footway in Hastings Terrace together with a 5 metre long by 2 metre wide footpath which links the south end of Tracey Street with Western Approach.

SCHEDULE 5

A 4.5 metre wide lane which extends 44 metres southwards from its junction with the back of the footway in Hastings Terrace together with an 8 metre long by 2 metre wide footpath which links the south end of the lane to Western Approach.

SCHEDULE 6

A 7 metres wide carriageway known as King Gardens with 2 footways one being 1.7 metres and one being 2.05 metres wide which extend a maximum of 31 metres southwards from its junction with the back of the footway in Hastings Terrace together with a 15 metre long by 2 metre wide footpath which links the south end of King Gardens to Western Approach.

SCHEDULE 7

Part of Hastings Terrace comprising a length of 1.75 metre wide footway on the south side of the carriageway which extends 87 metres eastwards from a point 8 metres east of the back of the east footway in Well Street to the west kerbline of King Gardens together with 0.65 metres of the adjoining carriageway.
