DISEASES OF FISH ACT 1937

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food has made the Diseases of Fish (Infected Areas) (No. 2) Order 1983.

This Order declares the following areas to be infected areas for the purpose of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937:

- (a) an area comprising Andwell Mill Trout Farm, Andwell, near Basingstoke, Hampshire;
- (b) an area comprising Mill Leat Trout Farm, The Mills, Ermington, near Ivybridge, Devon;
- (c) an area comprising Clouds Hill Trout Farm, Lynchmere, near Liphook, Hampshire;
- (d) an area comprising Riverside Trout Farm, Bowerchalke, near Salisbury, Wiltshire;
- (e) an area comprising Southwaite Mill Fish Farm, "Kelgarth", Eamont Bridge, near Penrith, Cumbria.

The Order provides that no person shall, without the previous consent in writing of the Minister, move out of the infected areas any live fish, eggs of fish or foodstuff for fish.
