

## SCHEDULE

*Land Comprised in the Authorisation*

The land which is about 1,045 acres (423 hectares) in extent, is situated partly in the Community of Llangendeirne in the District of Carmarthen and partly in the Communities of Llanelli Rural and Pembrey in the Borough of Llanelli in the County of Dyfed. It lies at the southern end of the Gwendraeth Valley, being bounded to the south-west by Trimsaran and to the north in part by Carway. Cil-feri-isaf Farmstead is situated to the east with Rehoboth Road (B4317) to the south. Culla Road (B4317), between Trimsaran and Carway, crosses the western part of the land but will be kept open at all times.

## OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under section 15 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958, on 11th March 1983, made the Ffos Las (Suspension of Public Rights of Way) Order 1983 suspending public rights of way with effect from 11th March 1983.

The rights of way which are suspended by the Order are described in Schedule (1) hereto.

A copy of the Order and of the map referred to therein have been deposited at the National Coal Board's Offices, Coedbach Disposal Point, Trimsaran Road, Kidwelly, Dyfed, and may be seen there at all reasonable hours.

## SCHEDULE (1)

*Rights of Way Suspended*

1. Part of a footpath No. 30/120 in the Community of Llangendeirne which runs from a point on the B4317 public road west of Carway Primary School in a general southerly direction for 530 metres to the derelict Duffryn Aur Farmstead being that part which extends from a point about 50 metres south of the stream known as Nant-y-Gro in a general southerly direction for about 258 metres. The footpath continues via the said Farmstead as footpath No. 57/13 in the Community of Pembrey, in a south-westerly direction for about 700 metres to terminate at its junction with footpath No. 57/14 referred to in paragraph 2 below and an unregistered footpath at a point about 380 metres north-east of Ffos Las Farmstead.

2. Footpath No. 57/14 in the Community of Pembrey which runs from its junction with footpath No. 57/13 referred to in paragraph 1 above at a point about 380 metres north-east of Ffos Las Farmstead in a general south-easterly then northerly direction via the derelict Gelli'r-wydd Farmstead for about 917 metres and continues in a north-easterly direction as footpath No. 30/123 in the Community of Llangendeirne for about 690 metres to terminate at its junction with footpath No. 30/122 proposed as a byway between Carway and Trimsaran at Maes Gwilym Farmstead.

3. Footpath No. 57/16 in the Community of Pembrey which runs from its junction with footpath No. 57/15 proposed as a byway between Carway and Trimsaran at a point about 482 metres south-south-west of the derelict Allt-Ysgrech Farmstead in a north-westerly then general westerly direction for about 704 metres to terminate at its junction with footpath No. 57/14 referred to in paragraph 2 above at a point about 50 metres east of the derelict Gelli'r-wydd Farmstead.

4. Footpath No. 57/17 in the Community of Pembrey which runs from its junction with footpath No. 57/15 proposed as a byway between Carway and Trimsaran at a point about 88 metres south-east of Waun Hir Farmstead in a northerly direction for 375 metres to terminate at its junction with footpath No. 57/14 referred to in paragraph 2 above about 20 metres south of Gelli'r-wydd Farmstead.

5. Part of footpath No. 57/19 in the Community of Pembrey which runs from footpath No. 57/18 about 80 metres north of No. 94 Garden Suburb, Trimsaran, in a general easterly direction for 736 metres to terminate at its junction with footpath No. 57/21 referred to in paragraph 7 below being that part which extends from a point about 130 metres north-east of the said dwelling to its termination.

6. Part of footpath No. 57/20 in the Community of Pembrey which runs from its junction with footpath No. 57/15 proposed as a byway between Carway and Trimsaran at a point about 490 metres south-west of the derelict Allt-Ysgrech Farmstead in a general south-easterly, easterly then southerly direction for about 1,656 metres to terminate at Rehoboth Road about 102 metres north-east of Rehoboth Chapel being that part which extends from its commencement for about 1,048 metres.

7. Part of footpath No. 57/21 in the Community of Pembrey which runs from a point about 280 metres north-east of the junction of Rehoboth Road with Llanelli Road in a northerly then north-easterly direction via the ruins of Plas Farmstead swinging westwards and again northwards for about 1,482 metres to terminate at its junction with footpath No. 57/15 proposed as a byway between Carway and Trimsaran at a point about 495 metres south-west of the derelict Allt-Ysgrech Farmstead being that part which extends from a point about 462 metres south-west of the ruins of Plas Farmstead for about 1,181 metres to its termination.

8. Part of footpath No. 57/22 in the Community of Pembrey which runs from a point adjacent to No. 53 Heol Llanelli, Trimsaran, in a general north-easterly direction for about 1,002 metres to its junction with footpath No. 57/21 referred to in paragraph 7 above being that part which extends from a point about 108 metres north-east of Waun-fynnonau Farmstead for about 372 metres to its termination.

## OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

Notice is hereby given that the National Coal Board intend to submit an application entitled the Garnant Application 1983 to the Secretary of State for an authorisation under section 1 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958 to work coal by opencast operations or to cause or permit coal to be worked by such operations and for an Order under section 15 of that Act suspending public rights of way. The land which the National Coal Board require to occupy in this connection and the rights of way to which the application for the Order relates are described below.

A copy of the application and of the accompanying map may be seen between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, except on 4th and 5th April 1983, at the National Coal Board's Offices, Tairgwraith, Gwaun-cae-Gurwen, Ammanford, Dyfed. Any objection to the application must be made in writing to the Secretary of State, c/o Welsh Office, Economic Planning (B)1, Cathays Park, Cardiff CF1 3NQ, before 25th April 1983, and should state whether it is to the grant of the authorisation or to the making of the Order suspending public rights of way and the grounds of objection.

*Description of Land*

The land which is about 285 acres (116 hectares) in extent is situated partly in the Communities of Betws and Cwmamman in the Borough of Dinefwr in the County of Dyfed. It lies immediately south of the village of Garnant in the Amman Valley, about 6 kilometres east of Ammanford and about 1.5 kilometres north-west of Gwaun-Cae-Gurwen. The south-western part is bounded by Grenig Road and Bryncethin Road lies to the east.

*Description of Public Rights of Way*

1. Footpath No. 67/16 in the Community of Cwmamman which runs from a point about 10 metres west of No. 25 Dynevor Road, Garnant, in a southerly direction for about 283 metres and continues as Footpath No. 3/49 in the Community of Betws for about 588 metres in a general south-westerly direction to terminate at its junction with Footpath No. 3/48 at a point about 18 metres east of the ruins of Bryn-cam-bach Farmstead.

2. Part of the footpath No. 67/18 in the Community of Cwmamman which runs from a point on New School Road, Garnant, in a general south-easterly then south-westerly direction for about 412 metres being that part which extends from a point about 30 metres north-west of No. 2 Belle Vue, Garnant, in a general south-easterly then south-south-westerly direction for about 358 metres. The footpath continues as footpath No. 3/48 in the Community of Betws in a south-south-westerly direction for about 1,190 metres to terminate at Gelliceidrim Fach
