

Traffic Act 1974 have made on 24th March 1983 a Traffic Order as follows:

To prohibit the use of the segregated cycleway/footway adjacent to Fenton Way, West Mayne and Durham Road (as specified in the Order) by any vehicle other than a pedal cycle.

2. A copy of the Order, together with a plan relating to the Order may be examined at this office between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. Monday to Friday.

3. If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 24th March 1983 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

This Order came into operation on 24th March 1983.

## LIVERPOOL CITY COUNCIL

### City of Liverpool Traffic Regulation Orders

Notice is hereby given that the City Council of Liverpool under agency arrangements with the Merseyside County Council proposes to make the following Orders under sections 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as subsequently amended, the effect of which will be:

1. The City Council of Liverpool (Cavendish Drive) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1983: to prohibit with certain exceptions, any vehicle from waiting at any time in the length of Cavendish Drive from its junction with Rice Lane in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 57 metres (187 feet).

2. The City Council of Liverpool (Moira Street) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1983: to prohibit, with certain exceptions, any vehicle from waiting at any time in Moira Street.

The exceptions referred to will enable a vehicle to wait for so long as is necessary: (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle; (b) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any wedding or funeral, any building, industrial or demolition operations, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein; (c) to enable the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; (d) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said road or length of road; and (e) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle.

A copy of the proposed Orders, the plans and statements of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Orders may be inspected at the City Solicitor's Office, Legal and Parliamentary Section, Room 34, Municipal Buildings, Dale Street, Liverpool, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

If you wish to object to either of the proposed Orders you should send the grounds for your objection, in writing, to the undersigned by the 4th May 1983.
