*Notice of Confirmation of Public Path Diversion Order**Kingswood District Council (Pol. 11 Oldland No. 1) Public Path Diversion Order 1983*

Notice is hereby given that on 28th March 1983 the Kingswood District Council confirmed the above-mentioned Order without modification.

The Order is being made to enable development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission K.1124/35 as granted under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or the enactments replaced by that part of the Act.

The effect of the Order is to divert the section of public footpath POL 11 in the District of Kingswood described in Schedule I, below, in the manner described in Schedule II below.

A copy of the confirmed Order and map contained in it has been deposited at the Council Offices, 26 South View, Staple Hill, Bristol and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m.—1 p.m. and 2 p.m.—5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

The Order becomes operative on the date when it is certified by Kingswood District Council that the alternative route is in a satisfactory condition for public use, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 28th March 1983 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SCHEDULE I

Description of Site of Existing Footpath

That length of footpath POL. 11 in the Parish of Oldland commencing at its junction with Wraxall Road and running in a generally east south easterly direction for a distance of 118 metres to its junction with a new road being constructed.

SCHEDULE II

Description of Site of Alternative Route

From the junction of footpath POL. 11 in the Parish of Oldland with Wraxall Road running in a generally east north easterly direction for a distance of 34 metres, then in a south south easterly direction for a distance of 73 metres and then along the footway of the new road in a generally east north easterly direction for a distance of 56 metres to rejoin the original line of the path at its junction with the new road being constructed. The new path will have a minimum width of 1.8 metres and a total length of 163 metres.

The District Council of West Lindsey (Footpath 169, Market Rasen) Public Path Diversion Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that on 7th March 1983 the District Council of West Lindsey confirmed the above-named Order. The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running in a North Westerly direction from the Southern boundary of Field OS3 for a distance of approximately 76 metres to a point on the Western boundary of Field OS3 approximately 37 metres North of the River Rase to a new line leaving the original path and following the Southern boundary of Field OS3 and the course of the River Rase for approximately 82 metres in a Westerly direction. The Path then strikes Northwards along the boundary of Field OS3 for approximately 37 metres to rejoin the original path.

A copy of the Order and Plan contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the District Council of West Lindsey, The Guildhall, Gainsborough and at the Area Office, John Street, Market Rasen and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours. A copy of the Order and the plan contained in it has also been deposited with Mr. R. A. Hall, Clerk to Market Rasen Town Council, 58 De Aston Terrace, Willingham Road, Market Rasen, and may be inspected at all reasonable hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 7th March 1983 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from the 31st March 1983, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
