> Brussels, Dec. 3. N. S. Letters from the Fron-tiers advise, that on the Twenty-fixth Instant a great Convoy of Forage and Meal parted from Namur, in order to be convey'd up the Sambre to Maubeuge, under a Guard of Six thousand Men, which were drawn out of the neighbouring Garri-fons for that purpose. Those Letters add, that a French Commissary had lately been Assassinated by some Officers belonging to the Garrison of St. Quintin, for his having complain'd against them to the Court, upon occasion of some Disorders their want-of Pay had oblig'd 'em to commit. Letters from Madrid of the Sixteenth of November, by the way of Paris, advise, that the Duke of Anjou and his Court were return'd thither, and had been receiv'd with the general Acclamations of the Inhabitants. They write from Paris, that Orders had been issued out to all the Officers belonging to the Army in Flanders, requiring 'em to have their Regiments compleat by the Month of March next.
