NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

The Medina Borough Council (Public Bridleway R.42 Binstead) Public Path Diversion Order 1983

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 29th April 1983, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Medina Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way R.42 running from a point approximately 20 metres south of the eastern end of Arnold Road, Binstead, Ryde, Isle of Wight, in a south-easterly direction for approximately 30 metres, then in a south-westerly direction for approximately 90 metres, then in a westerly direction for approximately 35 metres to a point approximately 105 metres south-east of Coniston Avenue, to a line running from a point on public right of way R.42 approximately 20 metres south of the eastern end of Arnold Road in a south-easterly direction for approximately 20 metres, then in a south-westerly direction for approximately 90 metres, then in a westerly direction for approximately 20 metres, to a point approximately 105 metres south-east of Coniston Avenue.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Medina Borough Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted

to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

Melton Borough Council (Long Clawson, G.32) Public Path Diversion Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that on 26th April 1983 the Council of the Borough of Melton confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert part of footpath number G32 which crosses the southern half of O.P. 2441, from its junction with Church Lane, Long Clawson for a distance of approximately 43 metres in a north-easterly direction to a line running from a point on the southern boundary of O.P. 2441, approximately 31 metres north-east of footpath G.32's junction with Church Lane, in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 36 metres to join footpath G32.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

Melton Borough Council (Asfordby G.62) Public Path Diversion Order 1983

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 29th April 1983 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Melton Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification will be to divert part of footpath G.62 which runs along the eastern boundary of number 6 Regency Road from a point 24 metres north of its junction with Regency Road, Asfordby, in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 5 metres then in a south south-westerly direction for a distance of 22 metres and in an easterly direction for a distance of 9 metres to rejoin the existing footpath at its junction with Regency Road and the south-eastern corner of number 6 Regency Road.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for confirmation, itself confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If
