The Alterations became operative on 9th November 1982, but if any person aggrieved by the Alterations desires to question their validity on the ground that they are not within the powers conferred by Part II of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or that any requirement of the said Part II or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Alterations, he may, within 6 weeks from 15th June 1983, make an application to the High Court under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

(b) *Publication of Approved Structure Plan Alterations and Related Documents*

Following the Secretary of State's approval of the Structure Plan Alterations referred to above, the County Council have, in accordance with the relevant regulations, reproduced the Alterations in the prescribed form, as the *Structure Plan for Oxfordshire: Minerals*. Copies are available at £1.50 (plus 21p p & p).

Accompanying the Structure Plan for Oxfordshire: Minerals is an *Explanatory Memorandum* which is intended to provide a guide to mineral operators and the public on the operative Structure Plan minerals policies. This is available at the same price, or the two documents may be bought together at the reduced price of £2.50 (plus 27 p & p).

The Council have also published a statement of planning policies for minerals to operate at a more detailed level pending the preparation of a statutory minerals local plan for the County. This—entitled *Interim Minerals Policies*—includes maps of the areas where land is more likely to be released for working, and is available at £1 (plus 17p p & p).

#### NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

*The Nottinghamshire County Council (Fiskerton Footpath No. 3) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1978*

Notice is hereby given that on 12th May 1983, the Secretary of State for the Environment confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish the public right of way running from a point, approximately 320 yards north-east of Fiskerton Junction on the south-eastern side of the railway line, in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 200 yards crossing over Marlock Dyke, continuing in the same south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 215 yards to a point opposite the junction with Gravelly Lane and Wilsons Lane.

The Order becomes operative as from 11th June 1983 but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 of the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 10th June 1983, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
