## From Monday, August 8. to Thursday August 11. 1670.

### Falmouth, Aug. 3.

He Constance of London bound for Virginia, which came in here the 31 past, put to sea this day with a fair wind, but another ship, her companion, having spent her Mast, is not yet refitted for her ve-

age. The Pearl Fregat of Briftol from the Barbados is cleered from this Port and put to fea the 2d inftant on her way for Holland.

Plymouth, Aug. 5. Here are lately arrived in this Port the Pearl of Briffol laden with Sugars, bound for Amsterdam. The Fame of Amsterdam laden with Salt, homewards bound. The Elizabeth of London with Provisions for Tangier, and one veilel of this place with Merchants Goods, intended for Ireland.

Hull, Aug. 6. This week failed hence one veffel for Amfterdam, and five veffels of Diepe, bound for Rouen, laden with the Commodities of these parts. Here are lately arrived Two Swedish ships from Stockholm laden with Iron, and two others from the East, laden with Flaxe.

Rome, July 26. The Princels Altieri the Popes Niece is lately brought to bed of a Son to his no fmall fatisfaction; the Cardinal Altieri flood for Godfather in the Popes room, and gave it the name name of Altieri Emilio Bonaventura Aleffandro Balthaftr; the Pope was pleafed upon this occafion to caufe a confiderable fum of Moneys by ! way of Alms to be distributed amongst the poor, 3000 Crowns to be given to his Niece for her expences in her lying in, and 10000 Crowns more to i the Prince her Husband to be raifed out of the vacant Offices, under the name of a gift to his lately declared Nephew; and as an obligation upon the People has ordered the Impost upon Meal 10 be taken off, and the weight of Bread to be augmented.

On Sunday last the Pope gave Audience in the Garden of the Quirinal to Monfegnior Nerle, and Buonvisi before their departure on their Nunciatures for Poland and Cologne.

Father Nithard has been received by the Pope with much kindnefs and lately made Bifhop of Giorgiento.

Monsegnior Borromeo is suddenly expected here from his Nunciature in Spain, with whom the Pope feems not to be fully fatisfy'd, in that he supposed him to have made too much haste to his new employment of Secretary of State, leaving the affairs of the Church there in the hands of a Spaniard.

Monfegnior Marefcotti is arrived here from the same Employment in Poland, and may in little time be dispatched hence with the same Character to suc-

ceed Borromeo in the Court of Spayne. The Pope who is now entred into the 81 years of his age, had like to have found it fatal to him upon the diftemper of a Dyfentery into which he fell upon the drinking his Wine over much cooled with Ice, but is again recovered to the no fmall fatisfaction o the City, as well as his dependent Relations.

The Spanish Anibassador having taken notice of feveral Quarrels and Difturbances which have lately hapned near his Pallace, has given order to the Provoft of the Wards, to passnightly by his Pal-lace, and to seife impartially upon any Spaniard, whom he shall find ro give the least occasion of •offence.

The Ambaffador from Savoy has not yet made his publick entry, keeping himfelf private and retired in the Convent of our Lady del Popolo. Cardinal Roberti has upon his acquaintance with him in Savoy given him a private Visit, but Cardinal Buona has refused it, though expected by the Ambaffador, although his Eminencyacknowledgeth himfelf a Subject of Savoy, infifting upon the Ceremony of the first Visit.

Genoua, fuly 26. Yesterday went hence the Dutch Convoy for Legorn, of which those from Zealand intend to pass forwards for Venice, but those of Rotterdam to return again for Spain with fuch Merchant ships as they shall find ready to take the opportunity of their Conduct. The Fame is now upon departure in company with two Genoueses of good force.

Monfegnior Lomellino, lately Vice-Legat in Avignoz arrived here on Thurfday laft, and after fome days of repose here, may depart on his return for Rome.

Yesterday passed by this Port a Gally of the squadron under the Command of the Duke of Turfi, having on board Monsegnior Borromeo on his return from his Nunciature at Madrid, to take possession of his new employment as Secretary of State to the present Pope. The Comte de Borromeo his Brother upon the first appearance of the faid Gally, immedistely put to fea and went on board to compliment him.

A vessel lately arriving from Palermo tells us, that the Prince de Ligne, the new Viceroy of Sicily arrived with five Gallies the 28th paft at Palermo; auf that the Duke d' Albuquerque had fent all his Baggage on board the fame Gallies which were defigned to transport him from thence into Spain.

From Milan we are told that the Duke d' Offuna having upon the review of the Army, found the Spanish forces much lessened, had ordered Six Captains and as many Enfignes to pass thence into Spain to Command and bring over 12- Companies of Foot for the recruits of the Three Spanish Tertias in that Government.

The Marquis de St Andre Montbrun, a perfon who was so eminently known through the world for his great fervices to the Republick of Venice, during the fiege of Candia, being arrived lately at Milan on his way for France, was complimented by the Governour, who made him a confiderable Prefent, in teltimony of the respects he had for his person and meries.

The Marquis de los Balbaces Spinola has for a time deferred his departure on his Ambasy to the Imperial Court at Vienna, expecting first the arrival of a Daughter to the Lady Marquelle de Mertara, who is to attend the Empress in the Honourable employ-

Vienna, July 30. Eighteen of the principal Jews, Inhabitants of this place are flopped here and fecured to make good any jebts that Thall be found to be due from any of that Religion upon their removeal.

The Empress being great with Child has thought fit to confine her self to her usual place of Refidence, where the intends to continue till her delivery.

The Count de Smartzenberg being made President of the Imperial Council in the Court, was the 28th instant admitted and installed with the usual Ceremonies.

From Waradin we are told, that the Grand Segnior has ordered the removal of feveral Baffas and other Officers from their Charges, and amongft others, the Baffa of Kanife, all of them having been fuspected to have privately fomented the late diffurbances in Hungary, by which means the Prime Visier has taken a fit occasion to prefer in their rooms such perfons as have signalized their valots in the siege of Gandia.

From Hungary we are told, that the Garifon in Efchird feemed for fome time refolved to have defended that place to the last man against the Imperialits, and d for that purpole disposed of their Ensigne and all their Artillery upon the Ramparts; which heat of valor laited them but for three days, in which t hey made a fally upon the beliegers, but find net rlos to be great, and the execution they did v ry little, on the 4th day they fet up the white Flag, and fent to the Camp to defire Three days Truce; but obtained only 24 hours time to treat of a furrender, in which space arrived the Princels Rigotski, who immediately concluded . for the delivery of that place, out of which marched about 900 Heydukes, besides other forces ; after which, four Companies of the Marquis de Gra na's Regiment entred the Fort, under the Command of Petter a General de Battaille; the reft of the Army marching for the reduction of Caffovia.

Hague, Ang. 15. All apprehensions of war being now laid aside, the States have thought fit to confider of the leffening of the publick expenses by difmissing the forces which were last raised for the recruits of the Army. The supernumerary Companies which were formerly put into Maessive for the strengthening of that Garrison, are withdrawn from thence and sent away to their former Quarters, leaving that place to the guard of the ordinary Garrison.

ry Garrison. The Heer de Groot is gone forward on his Embaffy towards the French Court, to obtain if possible, a Categoricel and positive answer about the new Impositions laid by him upon the Commodities of this Countrey imported into his Dominions.

The Heer Heinfius after his long attendance as Refident from the States of these United Provinces in Muscowy, finds little effect of his Negotiation as to the mediation offered in the differences between Swedeland and Muscowy, and is accordingly refolved to spend no longer time in the pursuit thereof, but is preparing for his return home.

Letters from the squadron of our ships before Salee tell us, that the Corsairs of that place seem to be very inclinal le to enter into an agreement with us, and have accordingly written to the Emperor of Morocco concerning it, b t we expect little assurance from that inconstant people.

A fhip which came lately from Santa Cruz ii Barbary affirms, that the Emperor of Morocco was with an Army of about 80000 Horfe marched towards that place, and had made himfelf master of the Fort called *Soes*, which furrendred to him without any oppolition, but the Governour of *Santa Cfuq*, though furprifed with fo fudden an invalion and wanting men, refolved however to make the beft defence he was able againft fo powerful an enemy, but the French and Portugais within the Town, had by their Prefents to the Governour obtained his leave to retire themfelves from that place, and embarked themfelves upon two flups which were then in that Port, with 'as much of their Goods, as they were able to carry off with them.

The States of Zealand are lately beiourned, flaving first disposed of fome vacant Offices in their Militia, and particularly were pleased to conferre that of Cornet to the Troop, former Frommanded by the late Captain Buar, upon young the his fon, and the charge of Captain of the Grans of that Province upon Monsieur d'Overkerk.

Paris. August 16. We have little farmer news from the Vivarois, but that fince the Determ of the Repels, the Surintendant Bezons proceeds to make fore examples of Juffice, having Sentenced two to be broken on the Wheel, fix to be hanged, and condemned a great number of the reft to the Gallyes: an Act of Pardon is fending thither for the Reft, but as yet de Rouure is not difcovered.

On Wednefday His Grace the Duke of Buckbingam went to St Germaines, where he had his Audience from his Most Christian Majeky, and still continues, amongst other diversions, His Majesty having entertained him with a review of his Army drawn out of the Camp at St Schaftien.

Plymouth, Aug. 7. All the fhips which went from these parts upon the Fishing trade to Nemfoundland are fasely arrived there, and hope for a good account of their voyage.

Portsmouth, Aug. 7. Yesterday were put into Spiri bead by contrary winds, the Hopsmel of London, John Brown Master, and the Lawrel-tree of Dartmouth, both from Barbados, laden and bound for London, having at their departure left that Island in a good and flourishing condition.
