TOny has been fent from hence to pay off all the Arrears due to the Troops in Hungary, to enable them to march wherever there shall be occasion. The Recruits for the Emthere than be occasion. The Receditis for the Emperor's Forces are rais'd in all the Hereditary Countries with very good Success; and it is fitill given out, that his imperial Majesty designs to raise several new Regiments. Letters from Constantinople of the Second or the lait Month, give an account, that the sace of Affairs there is much chang'd for the King of Sueden, whose Interest has in favour of the King of Sueden, whose Interest has prevail'd against the Grand Vizir; and, that the Sultan has consented to his Majesty's continuing all the Winter at Bender, notwithstanding the Vizir had order'd a Baffa to march with a Detachment to conduct that Prince out of the Turkith Dominions. The Sums appointed by the Port for the Subfiffance of the King and his Retinue, which had been flop'd for some time by Order of the Grand Vizir, have en remitted as formerly. The same Letters add, that the Haughtine's of the Ministers, occasion'd by the late Succeifes against the Muscovites, was grown to that heighth, that the common fort of Feople were no longer able to bear it, which, twas apprehended, might occasion a Revolt. The Grand Vizir had appointed to keep the Bairam at Adriancelle and were agreement that Champel and were agreed to the champel and the cha nople, and was expected with the Cham of Tartary at Constantinople the Fifteenth of the next Month. The Suedish Envoy, Monsieur Funk, is with that Minister, by whom he has been more favourably treated than formerly. The Muscovite Ambashador treated than formerly. The Mulcovite Amballador is still confin'd in the Seven Towers. All the Fleet is return'd from the Black Sea to Constantinople, except fix Sultans and two Gallies remaining with the Captain-Basha, who waits for the Surrender of Afoph.

Francfort, December 16. N. S. An Express arriv'd here Yesterday from Aschassembourg, with Advice, that the Emperor came to that Place the Fourteenth, about Four in the Afternoon, with a numerous Retinue; that the Elector of Mentz met his Imperial Majesty at the Foot of the Stairs of the Caitle, and after the usual Compliments, conducted him to the Apartment appointed for his Reception. Great Preparations are made here on the same Account, where he is expected on the Nineteenth of this Month at farthest. The Elector of I reves went away Post this Morning, to meet him at Aschaffembourg; but it is not yet known whether he will continue there, or return hither with the Elector of Mentz, that the Solemnity may be perform'd with the greater Magnificence.

Tournay, Decemb. 16. N. S. The Body of the Enemies Troops, Commanded by the Chevalier de Luxemburg, retir'd the Thirteenth, with much Precipitation, to Valenciennes; as did the other Body, under the Marefelial de Montesquion, to Arras, bring pursued by Lieutenant-General Bom-

pefch, with the Cavalry of his Garrison, to the Walls of that City, and feveral Kill'd and Taken as they were passing the Scarp at Fampoux. It is reported, that the Enemy had a Delign to draw a Line from Arleux to Valenciennes, wherein Eouchain was to be inclos'd, and to fire the Magazines of that Place, in order to attack it with more Success; but the two Incendiaries employ d for that Purpose having been discovered and taken, it has prevented the Execution of that Project. The Number of Deferters was very great upon this Ociation, who all Complain, that they have received no Pay for a

considerable time.

Hague, Decemb. 27. N. S. On Saturday the Nineteenth Instant, his Highness I rince Eugene of Savoy, and his Excellency the Earl of Strafford, as likewife, the Imperial Ministers Count Goes and Monsieur Heems, were for some time in Conterence with the Deputies of the States-General, after which the Prince Din'd with the British Amballador, and in the Afternoon a fecond Conference was held, wherein the fame Perions affiled as before, which being ended, Prince Eugene return'd to the Ambal-fador's House, and was there Entertain'd at Supper that Evening. The same Day arriv'd here an Exprefs from his Royal Highness the Duke of Savoy, on his way for England. Sunday Evening the Earl of Strafford was in Conference with the Grand Penfionary. The Day following was held as usual, the Congress of the States, with all the Foreign Minifters residing here, at which time arriv'd an Express from Franciort, with Advice, that the Emperor had made his Entry there the Eighteenth instant with great Splendor, and that the I wenty-third was appointed for the Day of his Coronation; whereupon, Monfieur Heems has prepar'd a Ball and Entertainment for feveral Persons of Distinction. This Day about Noon, the Deputies of the States-General af-fembled in the Chamber of Treves, and were in Conference for some Hours with the Foreign Ministers; about which time arriv'd an Express from England, and this Evening the Sates-General have again held a Consultation. To Morrow Morning the Commissioners for inspecting the British Troops in Spain, will fet out for Amsterdam, in order to puriue their intended Journey.
