The Mermaid-Gally, which lay sunk in this Harbour, hath been this Day weigh'd, and got into the Shore about fifteen Foot from whence she lay; and we hope next Tide to get her in much farther.

*Falmouth, Dec. 18.* On the Eleventh Sail'd the Union Pacquet with two Mails for Lisbon, Captain Jones Commander, with a great many Passengers: Also a small Sloop of this Place Sail'd for Lisbon.
