**M**onday last being the Festival of St. Clement, and the Day on which the Pope enter'd into the Twelfth Year of his Pontificate, he went to Chapel, attended by the College of Cardinals, who complimented him upon that Occasion. Cardinal Imperiali, Legate to the Emperor at Milan, being come to Genoa, in his Return hither, the Gallies are Sail'd from Civita Vecchia, in order to attend him; and the Duke d'Atri, Nephew to Cardinal Aquaviva, designing shortly to proceed to Madrid, has taken the Opportunity of that Convoy. The Differences that have lately happen'd at Lecta between the Bishop, the Town, and the Ministers of the Court of Justice, are the general Subject of Discourse here, and very much perplex our Court. They are grounded on certain Franchises, which the Clergy pretend to, and have been oppos'd by the Town for a Year past. The Bishop having hereupon Excommunicated three of the Court of Justice, the Delegate of the Royal Jurisdiction of the Collateral Council of Naples summoned him to appear before him, according to Custom, by an exhortatory Letter; and that Prelate refusing to comply therewith on several Pretences, the Viceroy of Naples has at length receiv'd Orders from Barcelona to oblige him to depart the Kingdom; and Guards are accordingly appointed to conduct him to the Frontiers. In the mean time, that Prelate has pronounc'd Sentence of Excommunication against the President and the rest of the Ministers of the Royal Court of Justice, and laid an Interdict upon the City and Diocese. Thus that Affair seems to be more irreconcilable than ever; and the Resolutions of this Court thereupon are impatiently expected. A Report having been spread, that the German Troops Quarter'd in the Territories of Sienna have a Design upon Porto Longone and Porto Hercole, Signior Molinez is drawing together all the Forces he can to oppose that Undertaking, and daily holds Conferences with the Partisans of the two Crowns upon that Subject. 'Tis said, that the Emperor has order'd all the Revenues of the Abby belonging to Cardinal Guaitieri in the State of Milan, to be put under Sequestration. Monsieur Doria is come hither from Avignon, to solicit the Government of that City, in the room of Monsieur Caffarelli, who lies at the Point of Death.

*Dresden, Decemb. 13. N. S.* The Queen our Electress intends to set out on Thursday from Torgau in her Return to this Place; where Her Majesty will pass the Winter. Count Pflug, one of the Ministers of King Augustus, being fallen sick, Count Hegen, another Minister of State, set out Yesterday to attend his Majesty in the Camp before Stralsund. Monsieur Milititz, a Privy Counsellor, is also order'd to repair thither; and 'tis said, that when he has receiv'd his Instructions, he will be sent back to Frankfort, where he formerly attended the

Prince Royal. 'Tis given out, that the Countess of Cossel has been created Princess of Lansperg. We have a Report, that part of the Suedish Successors are arriv'd in the Island of Rugen, under General Steinbock.

*Hamburg, Decemb. 15. N. S.* It has been notify'd to our College of Commerce, that the States-General of the United Provinces have taken off the Prohibition laid on Silesia Linnen; and Lunenburg Yarn, on Condition that the Importers of those Commodities, bring sufficient Certificates from the Magistrates of those Places, where such Manufactures are made, that there is no Infectious Distemper among 'em. Our Advices of the Eighth, from the Camp before Stralsund, give no positive Account of the arrival of the Suedish Forces in those Parts, any farther, than that Seven great Men of War have been seen near Grypswald, suppos'd to be Suedes. Two thousand five hundred Men have been detach'd from the Camp, to Conduct the Artillery from Grypswald to the Army, and they still talk of making a Descent on the Island of Rugen. Part of the Prisoners lately taken by the Danes, in the Sally made by the Garrison of Wismar, are to be sent to Glucksat, and the rest to Rensbourg. A Detachment of the aforesaid Garrison, has surpriz'd Monsieur Schonbeck, Great Treasurer of Poland, with another Polish Nobleman, who had Fifteen thousand Ducats about 'em, and a Draught of a new Treaty lately concluded between the Czar of Muscovy and King of Poland, to whom they were carrying it to the Camp before Stralsund. The last Accounts from Stockholm inform us, that King Stanislaus, was to continue at Christianstadt, 'till such time as he could learn what Success the Supplies lately sent into Pomerania under General Steinbock had met with. They write from Copenhagen, that great Magazines are erecting there, and in several other parts of Denmark, for Visualling their Navy, and Transporting Provisions into Pomerania. That part of the Danish Fleet was again Sail'd from thence towards that Coast, and that the rest would soon follow. Two Battalions of Foot, and three Regiments of Horse were come into the Neighbourhood of that City, so that they were no longer Apprehensive of any Attempt from the Suedes.

*Falmouth, Decemb. 15.* Yesterday came in here to Load Pilchers for the Streights, the Union Frigate, of and from Bristol, Isaac Knight Commander, and the Ann of Dublin from Rotterdam, who was taken off the Start by a French Privateer of twelve Guns, and Ransom'd for One hundred pound, James Beach Master. This Day came in the Johannah of Zurickzee, from Dublin, with Corn from Faro, Baudwin Cornelius Master.

*Dartmouth, Decemb. 15.* A Dutch Skipper is order'd out for Torbay to perform Quarantain, having had his Mate on Board

a Vessel in the Downs, that came from Bremen. Come in the Adriatick, Real and Incomparable Gallies of London, for the Streights.

*Bristol, Decemb. 17.* Last Night came in to Kingroad, the Jefferies Gally of this Port, Joseph Thomas Commander, in eight Weeks and odd Days from Jamaica, who came out in Company with the Diamond Gally, the Salisbury and Fame, all of and for this Port. This Day came in the Mary Gally of Pool, Thomas Curtain, Commander from Newfoundland, but last from Ireland: He left Her Majesty's Ship the Hastings at Kingsale Careening.

*Deal, Decemb. 18.* Here are Her Majesty's Ships the Falmouth, Le Moor, Hampshire, Bonadventure, Mary Gally, Roebuck, Dunwich and Gibraltar. The Outward-bound mention'd in my last are still here. And last Night came down the London Gally for Leghorne.
