#### WELSH OFFICE

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has, on the application of the South Glamorgan County Council, made an Order under section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 extinguishing subject to some exceptions, any rights persons may have to use vehicles on the length of highway described in the Schedule to this notice.

Copies of the Order may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of South Glamorgan County Council, County Headquarters, Newport Road, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and describing to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 11th July 1983, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Any person who, at the time of the coming into force of the Order, has an interest in land having lawful access to the length of highway to which the Order relates shall be entitled to be compensated by the South Glamorgan County Council as the local planning authority in respect of any depreciation in the value of his interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable.

#### SCHEDULE

Description of highway to which this notice relates (all distances are approximate). The highway is at Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan and is that length of Park Lane which extends from its junction with Queen Street in a general northerly direction for a distance of 14 yards.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping up of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice to enable development to be carried out.

Copies of the Order may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of Cardiff City Council, City Hall, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the 11th July 1983, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

#### (all distances are approximate)

The highway to be stopped up is a Cardiff in the County of South Glamorgan and is that length of Heol Hir which extends from a point 350 yards north of its junction with Everest Avenue in a general northerly direction for a distance of 102½ yards.
