*Hague, Jan. 5. N. S.* His Excellency the Queen of Great Britain's Ambassador, and the Imperial Ministers, held several Conferences in the Chamber of Treves, with the Deputies of the States-General, Saturday, Yesterday, and this Morning; at all which Prince Eugene of Savoy was assisting. They write from Frankfort, of the Thirtieth, that his Imperial Majesty propos'd to leave that Place the Eleventh of this Month, in order to proceed to Vienna. The freshest Letters from Paris advise, that Monsieur du Caffé, with the Squadron under his Command, having suffer'd much at Sea, was arriv'd at Martineco.

*Hague, Jan. 8. N. S.* On Wednesday the 6th Instant, Monsieur Marhal, the Prussian Minister, set out from hence in the Morning, in order to embark on Board the William and Mary Yatch for Great Britain. About Noon, his Excellency the Earl of Strafford, and the Minister of the King of Poland, were in Conference with the Deputies of the States-General. And the Day following, his Excellency was desir'd to assist at an extraordinary Assembly of the States-General.

*London, Dec. 29.* The Lord Privy-Seal, one of Her Majesty's Plenipotentiaries for the Treaty of General Peace, embark'd at Deptford on Monday the Twenty-fourth of December; but the contrary Winds kept his Lordship at Gravesend till Friday the Twenty-eighth, and at Six that Night he set sail.
