ACQUISITION OF LAND ACT 1981

The Greater London (Hayes By-Pass, Ealing, Hillingdon and Hounslow) Compulsory Purchase Order 1983, Land Forming Part of Brookside Playing Fields Open Space.

The Greater London Council have submitted this Compulsory Purchase Order to the Secretary of State for Transport which, if confirmed will authorise them to purchase land which forms part of an open space as defined in the above-mentioned Act. This land is described in the First Schedule hereto and is shown coloured pink on the map referred to in paragraph 4 below.

2. The Acquisition of Land Act 1981 requires that the Order shall be subject to special Parliamentary procedure in so far as it authorises the purchase of land forming part of an open space unless the Secretary of State for the Environment certifies that he is satisfied that other land has been or will be given in exchange for the open space, which is not less in area and is equally advantageous to any persons entitled to rights of common or other rights and to the public, and that the land given in exchange has been or will be vested in the persons in whom the open space was vested, subject to the like rights, trusts and incidents as attached to the open space. The Secretary of State for the Environment intends to issue such a certificate. The land proposed to be given in exchange is described in the Second Schedule hereto and is shown coloured green on the map referred to in paragraph 4 below.

3. The Secretary of State for the Environment is required to give formal notice of his intention to issue a certificate before he reaches a decision, to give an opportunity for objections to be made. He hereby gives such notice. Any representations or objections in relation to this proposal
