Genoa, December 27. N. S.

ON Tuesday last one of our Gallies came back from Marſailles, having carried an Envoy Extraordinary from this Republick to the Court of France, and the Captain of that Veſſel reports, that there were ſeveral Corſairs of Barbary cruizing in thoſe Seas. The next Day there arriv'd here two English Men of War, who have taken in great ſtoes of Ammunition for Barcelona, and ſet Sail Yeſterday for that Place, having under their Convoy ſeveral Veſſels laden with Corn and other Proviſions for the Army in Catalonia. Colonel Killegrew, who is come hither from Great Britain, is going for Barcelona; and the Count de Molaert has made uſe of this Opportunity for his Paſſage thither, with ſome Diſpatches from his Imperial Maſteſty. The Count de Medignani, Senator of Milan, who is to be Regent of the Council for Italy at Barcelona, is likewiſe gone on Board one of the ſame Veſſels.

Vienna, Jan. 16. N. S. We have an Account here, that his Imperial Maſteſty was pleaſed, upon the Eighth Inſtant, to promote the following Perſons to be Knights of the Order of the Golden Fleece; Duke Anthony Ulſich of Wolfenbuttel, the Duke of Modena, the Duke of Guaftalla, the Prince Emanuel of Savoy, the Prince of Swartzenberg, the Prince of Biſignano, the Prince of San Severo Sangro, the Prince Don Livia Odeſchalchi, the Prince de Sirmia, the Count de Kinski, the Count Rodolf de Sinzendorf, Great Chamberlain, the Count d'Altham, the Count de Palfi, Ban of Croatia, the Count de Thau, the Count de Cifuentes, the Count de Colebrat, the Count de Oropeza, the Count de Sentellas, the Count de Colorado, and the Count de Paar, Poſt-maſter General of the Imperial Hereditary Countries. Yeſterday upon the opening of the Council of the Empire, ſeveral new Counſellors took the Oaths required there, and their Seats in that Aſſembly. The Count Nicolini Palfi, Veit Mareſchal of the Emperor's Armies, and Guardian of the Crown of Hungary, took his Seat in the Privy-Council, in the Preſence of the Empreſs Regent, and is to ſet out to-morrow to Compliment the Emperor in

the Name of the ſaid Empreſs. Our laſt Advices from Prague, the Capital of Bohemia tell us, that ſeveral Deputies from that Kingdom, were departed thence, to meet and attend his Imperial Maſteſty, who was expected at Glattau upon the Twentieth, and according to the Rout he had propoſed, would be at Prague upon the Twenty-ſeventh.

Berlin, January 19. N. S. The Anniversary of the King of Prussia's Coronation has been ſolemnized here with the utmoſt Magnificence; and his Maſteſty receiv'd the Compliments of the whole Court, as well as of the Nobility, the ſuperior Courts of Juſtice, and all the Foreign Miniſters. His Maſteſty has been pleas'd to make a Promotion of four Perſons to be Knights of the Order of the Black Eagle; who are, the Prince de Naſſau Dieſt, the Count de la Lippe, the Count de Spaen, and the Baron de Siebourg. We have Letters from Dresden which ſay, that the King of Poland arriv'd there on the Fifteenth, being accompanied by ſeveral of his General Officers; and, that the Campaign in Pomerania was entirely over, the Armies being march'd to take their Winter-Quarters; and that the Sieges of Stralfund and Wiſmar were deſerr'd till the Spring. We have Advices from the Frontiers of Turkey, by the way of Poland, that the King of Sweden was making great Magazines at Bender; which, if true, looks as if he had ſome Proſpect of inducing the Ottoman Port to enter into ſome Engagements in his Favour.

Cologne, Jan. 19. N. S. The Elector Palatin paſſ'd by this Place Yeſterday in his return from Frankfort, and was ſaluted with a triple Diſcharge of the Cannon from the Ramparts of the Place, and by the fire-Arms of the Burgeſſes, who were drawn out on the Banks of the Rhine upon that Occaſion; two Burgomaſters went to Compliment him on board his Brigantine, and made him a Preſent of Wine and other Reſreſhments; They accompany'd him to Mulheim, where his Electoral Highneſs lay that Night, and went the next Day for Duſſeldorp, where he was receiv'd with the Diſcharge of their Cannon and Artillery, and all other proper Marks of their Duty.
