The Tower Hamlets (Prescribed Routes) (No.) Traffic Order 198

Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council propose to make the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The general effect of the Order would be to:

(a) impose one-way working for vehicles from north-west to south-east in Barnet Grove between Elwin Street and Gosset Street;

(b) prohibit vehicles, by means of a barrier, from entering or leaving that length of Ravenscroft Street which lies south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Columbia Road, at that kerb-line.

3. The prohibition referred to in paragraph 2 (b) above would not apply in relation to pedal cycles which follow the route through the barrier indicated by traffic signs.

4. The prohibition and requirement referred to in paragraph 2 above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

5. The one-way working referred to in paragraph 2 (a) above would not apply in respect of anything done in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

6. A copy of the proposed Order and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this notice is published in Room B.72, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.
