IMPORTATION OF ANIMAL PRODUCTS AND POULTRY PRODUCTS ORDER 1980 (AS AMENDED)

Notice is hereby given that as provided by Article 4 of the Importation of Animal Products and Poultry Products Order 1980, as amended, the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Welsh Office Agricultural Department have with effect from 1st January 1984 revoked the following General Licences and replaced with new General Licences with amended conditions as detailed below.

REVOKED LICENCES

Subject: Deboned fresh meat of bovine animals excluding offals.

(b) WOAD/GEN/80/67 (in Wales).

NEW GENERAL LICENCES

Subject: Deboned fresh meat of bovine animals excluding offals.

Country: Brazil.

Licences are valid through:

- (a) Avonmouth, Dover (Eastern Dock), Felixstowe, Folkestone, Grimsby, Gatwick Airport (cartoned meat only), Harwich (Parkestone Quay), Heysham (cartoned meat only), Liverpool, Newhaven, Plymouth, Poole (cartoned meat only), Sheerness, Southampton (cartoned meat only), Tyne (North Shields), Tilbury (in England).
- (b) Cardiff (in Wales).

CONDITIONS ATTACHING TO THIS LICENCE

A. Each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate in accordance with the terms of Commission Decision 78/694/EEC (as amended) taken under Council Directive 72/462/EEC signed by an official veterinarian of the Government of Brazil stating:

- (1) (a) Details of consignment.
- (b) Address(es) and veterinary approval Nos.(s) of the slaughterhouse/cutting plant.
- (c) Destination of meat including means of transport.
- (2) Health attestation:
 - (a) the deboned fresh meat described above is obtained from:

(i) bovine animals which have remained in the territory of Brazil (States of Rio Grande do Sul, Minas Gerais, Santa Catarina, Parana, Sao Paulo, Rio de Janeiro, Goias, Bahia and Espirito Santo) for at least 3 months before being slaughtered or since birth in the case of animals less than three months old;

(ii) bovine animals which have spent this period in a region in which foot-and-mouth disease vaccination of bovine animals is regularly carried out and officially controlled;

(iii) animals which come from holdings in which there has been no outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease in the previous 60 days, and around which within a radius of 25 kilometres there has been no case of foot-and-mouth disease for 30 days;

(iv) animals which have been transported direct from their holding of origin to the approved slaughterhouse concerned without passing through a market, without contact with animals which do not comply with the conditions required for export of their meat to the Community, and if conveyed in a means of transport, the latter has been cleaned and disinfected before loading;

(v) animals which have passed the ante-mortem health inspection referred to in Chapter V of the Annex to Directive 72/462/EEC at the slaughterhouse during the 24 hours before the slaughter and have in particular been subject to examination of the mouth and feet and showed no evidence of foot-and-mouth disease;

(b) the deboned fresh meat is obtained from an establishment or establishments in which, after a case of foot-and-mouth disease has been diagnosed, further preparation of meat for export to the European Community has only been authorised after slaughter of all animals present, removal of all meat, and the total cleaning and disinfection of the establishment under the control of an official veterinarian;

(c) the deboned fresh meat described above originates from carcasses which have matured at a room temperature of more than +2°C for at least 24 hours before the bones were removed.

B. Any meat imported under this licence shall be made available if so required for inspection by an officer of the Ministry at any place nominated by him for such inspection. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him to carry out the inspection in such manner as he shall determine and the importer shall be responsible for meeting any costs of carrying out such an inspection.

NOTE. This licence will not be invalidated by transit of the products through any other country provided they are transported in sealed containers and provided that if the goods are examined by Customs en route the containers are resealed and the documents are endorsed accordingly.

THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1968, AS AMENDED

Greece: Official Certificate

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Wales acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Imported Food Regulations (S.I., 1968 No. 97), as amended by the Imported Food (Amendment) Regulations 1973, 1979 and 1981 (S.I., 1973 No. 1351, S.I., 1979 No. 1426 and S.I., 1981 No. 1085) give notice that they hereby restrict recognition of the Official Certificate reproduced in Part 1 of the Schedule to the notice published in the *London Gazette* dated 22nd February 1983 for the importation of cured or smoked meats and meat products from Greece, to the extent shown in the Schedule hereto.

Part 2 of the Schedule to the notice published in the *London Gazette* dated 22nd February 1983 is hereby revoked.
