BUCKINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The Buckinghamshire County Council (Holmers Farm Way, High Wycombe) (Bus Stops) (Clearway) Order 1984.

Notice is hereby given that on 29th February 1984 the Buckinghamshire County Council made the above-named Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 12th March 1984, is to prohibit any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day in the length of road referred to in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions to the Order will permit the following:

- (1) Waiting with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden;
- (2) Waiting for so long as may be necessary:
 - (a) for enabling works to be carried out;
 - (b) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; and
- (3) Waiting for so long as may be necessary in any case where the person in control of the vehicle is:
 - (a) required by law to stop;
 - (b) is obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident;
 or
 - (c) is prevented from proceeding by circumstance beyond his control.

A copy of the Order together with a map showing the lengths of road concerned may be examined at County Hall, Aylesbury, and at Wycombe District Council Offices, Queen Victoria Road, High Wycombe, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from 29th February 1984, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Notice is hereby given that Buckinghamshire County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972, section 1 of the Heavy Commercial Vehicles (Controls and Regulations) Act 1973, Schedule 6 of the Road Traffic Act 1974 and the Transport Act 1982, the effect of which Order will be to prohibit any heavy commercial vehicle which has an operating weight exceeding 7.5 tonnes proceeding in a northerly direction along the road specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this notice from entering the road specified in column 2 of the said Schedule.

The Order will provide for the revocation of The Buckinghamshire County Council (Gawcott Road, Buckingham) (Prohibition of Entry of Heavy Commercial Vehicles) Order 1983.

The Order is being made to bring the definition of a heavy commercial vehicle up to date in the light of new statutory provisions.

A copy of the proposed Order and a map showing the lengths of road referred to, with a copy of the statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at County Hall, Aylesbury, and at the office of Aylesbury Vale District Council, Bank House, Bridge Street, during normal office hours.

Notice is hereby given that on 29th February 1984, the Buckinghamshire County Council made the above-named Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974.

The effect of the Order, which will come into operation on 12th March 1984, is to prohibit any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait at any time on any day in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions to the Order will permit:

- (1) Waiting with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden.
- (2) Waiting for so long as may be necessary:
 - (a) for enabling works to be carried out;
 - (b) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; and
- (3) The waiting of disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the "orange badge" scheme.
