Hamborough, February 12. N. S.

HE Administrator of the Duchy of Holstein having notice that his Danish Majerty would pafs through those Territories, went accompany'd with the Count Dernath, and the Ba-ron Goertz, to wait upon him at a Place call'd Pophiotz, where they had a Conference of 'two Hours, Monsieur Klepping, first Aid de Camp to the King of Denmark, is arriv'd here with a Com-mission from his Masler to King Augustus, in order to confult with him concerning the Operations of the next Campaign : He is likewife to treat with feveral Princes of the Houle of Saxony, to put feveral thousand Men into his Master's Service; fo that the Danes affirm, that in the begin ning of May their Army will be ready to enter Pomerania with thirty thousand Men, without flerday, have deliver'd their Credentials to the comprehending the Saxons and Muscovites; and States-General, and have been acknowledg'd by that his Czarish Majelty will raise eight thousand them in that Quality. The Baron d'Els, who is Men to augment his Troops in Pomerania. The King of Denmark will have his Army all cloath'd in red, and accordingly their Habits are making at prefent in this City. His Majesty arriv'd at Coldingen on the Twenty eighth, where General Scholten, and all the Danith General Officers, are expected to affift at a Council of War. His Majefty has likewife fent Orders to his Council at Copenhagen to come to Coldingen, and attend him there during the remaining part of this Winter; but they will be oblig'd to perform their Quarantaine before their Arrival there.

Hanover, February 12. N. S. The Duke of Wolfenbuttel, together with the Hereditary Prince and Princes, and the two Princes of Bevern, came to this Place upon the Twenty-fifth of January, to partake of the Diversions of the Carnival. The Duke, after a finall Stay, return'd to Brunswick, to prepare all things neceffary for the Fair, which began on the Eighth of this Month. The Count de Schon-born, who was formerly the Emperor's Minister at Hamborough, to compose the Differences between the Magistrates and Inhabitants of that City, arriv'd here on Sunday, and fet forward Yesterday in his way thither, with a new Commission to the same purpole from his prefent Imperial Majesty. Mon-fieur Groat, Envoy from the Elector of Hanover, is preparing to follow him in a few days. Monfieur the Ministers of the Empire, about Matters relating Urbich, Minister of the Czar, who had attended his to the Interests of their respective Masters, Membors Imperial Majefty at Frankfort, is gone through this Place to Vienna, where he is to refide in a publick Character. We have Advices from Poland, and feveral other Places, which fay that the Port is refolv'd to renew the War against the Muscovites, and that the Cham of Tartary has already given Orders to part of his Troops to march into Muscovy, and attack it on the other fide of Aloph, if it were possible. These Letters add, that the Sultan himself would go into the Field, together with the Cham of Tartary, who is very much in his Favour. They fay the King of Sweden is fill at Bender, and the Palatine of Kiovia is not march'd from thence; but, that fterdam, the Popkansburgh for Middleburgh, all they expect the Declaration of War, and a Body of from <u>Gurafe</u>; who in their <u>Paffage home took one</u>

Troops to join them; after which, they will enter upon Action. We hear by the hit Poft, that the Cham of Tartary was gone from Constantinople, to give neceffary Orders, and to put all his Troops in Motion. This Day will put an end to the Diverfions of the Carnival.

Hague, February 26. N. S.' The Earl of Strafford, who came hither for fome Days, has had feve-ral Conferences with the Ministers of this State, and departed hence for Utrecht on Tuefday laft, after having renew'd feveral Treaties for Troops that are to be paid by Her Majefty. The l'lenipotentia-ries of the Emperor, of Portugal, of Heffe Caffel, of Munfler, and other Princes, are likewife fet forward for Utrecht. Monfieurs Effchenbrenar and appointed by the Elector of Treves, to affift, on his part, at the Congress at Utrecht for a General Peace, is preparing to fet forward thither.

Utrecht, March 1. N. S. Yesterday-morning the Plenipotentiaries of the Allies held their usual Con-ference; at which the Ministers of Treves, Munster, and Heffe, affilted for the first time, and exhibited . their full Powers, as did likewise the Imperial and Portuguele Ministers, who were at the Hague when a former Conference was held on this Occasion. The Ministers of the Allies did likewife, at this Confeference, agree upon the Manner in which they are to deliver in their Demands to those of France on Saturday next, after they have been mutually communicated to each other ; which all the Ministers of the Allies hope may be done at their next Conference on Thuriday. An Express is pass'd through this Place in his way to the Hague, being dispatched from the Dutch Amballador at Conftantinople to the States, with certain Advice, that the Turks had declared War against the Muscovites, and deligned to enter upon Action very soon in the Spring. Baron Gersdorff, the King of Poland's Minister, is arrived here from the Hague; he has been in Conference with the British and other Plenipotentiaries, and defigns to return in a few days. Yesterday-morning a Conferencewas held at Count Sinzendorff's, of all to the Interests of their respective Masters, Membors of that great Body. Messieurs Buys and Goslinga, with the Count de Rechteren, three of the States Plenipotentiaries, went on Saturday to the Hague, and are expected back to Morrow, with the last Re-folutions of the States agreeable to the prefent Situ= ation of Affairs, before they give in their Demands to the French Ministers, who continue to affure us, the King their Master is in very good Health, notwithstanding the Reports rais'd here to the contrary.
